A SPOTLIGHT ON: RELATIONSHIPS, SEX & HEALTH EDUCATION



At St Ann's, we are committed to supporting every child's development and wellbeing through a broad and inclusive curriculum. One important part of this is RHSE – Relationships, Health and Sex Education – which is taught as part of our Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) programme using Jigsaw: the mindful approach to PSHE.

What is RHSE?

RHSE is a statutory part of the primary curriculum in England. It equips children with essential life skills to stay safe, healthy, and happy, both online and offline. The curriculum includes:

- ◆ **Relationships Education:** families, friendships, respectful relationships, and staying safe
- ◆ **Health Education:** mental wellbeing, healthy lifestyles, internet safety and understanding how our bodies change

These topics are explored in an age-appropriate, sensitive way through weekly lessons. The aim is to give children the knowledge and confidence to navigate the world around them with empathy and awareness.

Why is RHSE important?

Children today grow up in a complex, fast-paced world. RHSE helps them to build strong values, understand their emotions, develop healthy relationships and make informed decisions. Research shows this education contributes to later, safer experiences and helps reduce risk-taking.

How is it taught?

Jigsaw PSHE is a whole-school programme taught through six key themes, or 'Puzzles', each lasting a half-term. Topics such as 'Changing Me' and 'Relationships' are covered in the summer term. Lessons are designed to be inclusive, engaging and respectful of all backgrounds and beliefs.

What about puberty and reproduction?

In Key Stage 2, children learn about the changes their bodies go through during puberty and, where appropriate, human reproduction. This is taught with care, using correct terminology and simple, clear explanations. This is to meet our safeguarding obligations. While Relationships and Health Education is compulsory, parents may request to withdraw their child from any *non-statutory* Sex Education lessons. Please refer to the letter sent out in April and the information from the parent workshop for more specific details.

Working together

We believe RHSE works best when schools and families work in partnership. Open conversations at home are key to reinforcing what children learn in school. If you have any questions following our RHSE parent workshops this week, or would like to learn more, please contact your child's class teacher or Miss Foster (Personal Development Lead).

Together, we aim to nurture safe, confident and respectful young people, ready for the challenges of the future.

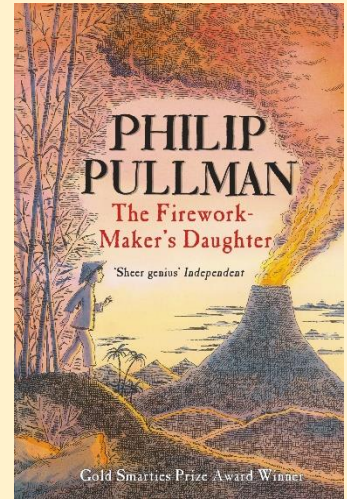

Y1 PHONICS COMPETITION

EARLY YEARS DROP INS

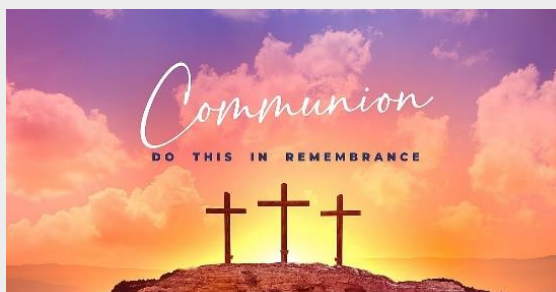

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #28



What is safeguarding in sport?

Safeguarding in sport means protecting children and young people from abuse, preventing harm and promoting their wellbeing.

For sports clubs and organisations this means having:

- effective safeguarding policies and procedures
- codes of conduct for sport
- safe recruitment processes
- relevant training for staff and volunteers.

What to look for in a sports club, group or activity;

Look for a sports club, group or activity that takes the safety and wellbeing of your child seriously. Always check if the club or organisation have the right safeguarding policies and procedures in place.

Make sure they can do the following for your child;

- Provide a safe environment
- Have a welfare officer
- You have completed relevant paperwork including emergency information.
- Ensure they have completed relevant training and checks.

Remember, it's never wrong to ask for more information when it comes to children's and young people's safety, wellbeing and safeguarding. Organisations should welcome questions about their activities and policies and should have answers on hand if you ask.

DENTAL SUPPORT FOR EARLY YEARS CHILDREN

This initiative is a collaborative effort between St Helens Family Hubs, the University of Liverpool School of Dentistry, and St Helens Wellbeing Service (CHCP), aimed at promoting early years oral health care. - **Time:** 10.00am to 2.00pm
- **Location:** Central Link Family Hub, Westfield Street (off Peter Street), St Helens WA10 1QF

What will the Smile Squad team do? A Smile Squad team member will conduct a brief oral health check for each child. This check will not replace the usual dental check-up, but it will help identify if further assessment is needed. We can also assist families who do not currently have a dentist. Our goal is to help ease children's dental anxiety and ensure they receive the care they need.

Additional Activities:

- Tips and tricks for maintaining healthy teeth and gums, provided by the Smile Squad team and St Helens Wellbeing Service (CHCP).
 - Free samples of toothpaste and toothbrushes.
 - Meet and greet with Croc-o-Smile and Captain Tuck, our friendly mascots.

Why are we doing this? Healthy teeth are essential for a child's well-being and development. Tooth decay and sore teeth are preventable, and we understand that accessing dental care can be challenging for some families. This event aims to bridge that gap and provide valuable resources and support.

FINAL PHASE OF CHILDCARE EXPANSION: GET 30 HOURS CHILDCARE - APPLY NOW

From this September, 15 hours childcare for working families with children under 3 will expand to 30 hours, meaning eligible working families can now apply for 30 hours of childcare from the term after their child turns 9 months until they reach school age.

This expansion is designed to support your child's early education and help you better balance work and family life. It's the final phase of the childcare expansion, which could save families up to £7,500 per year. **Apply for your childcare code by 31 August** to start using the support from September

What you need to do:

[Check if you're eligible:](#) Working parents in England may be entitled to up to 30 hours of childcare per week for children aged 9 months to school age, during term time (38 weeks per year).

[Apply online via GOV.UK:](#) If you're eligible, apply now for your childcare code - you'll need this to access your hours.

- **Apply by 31 August:** To start using your hours from 1 September, make sure you apply before the deadline.
 - **Speak to your childcare provider:** Check that they offer the hours and confirm their arrangements.
- **Keep your code up to date:** you'll need to reconfirm your details every 3 months via your GOV.UK account. You'll get a reminder when it's time. Already using 15 hours childcare for working families? You don't need to reapply for a new code. Simply continue to reconfirm your details every 3 months on your GOV.UK account and your existing code will update automatically to enable you to take up 30 hours from September.

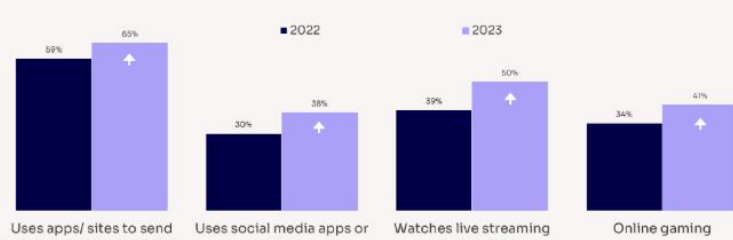

OPEN WATER: DON'T TAKE THE RISK

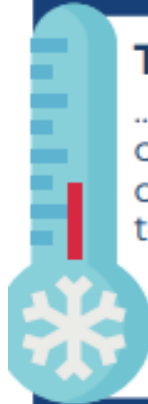


Swimming in or playing near rivers and canals may seem like a great idea, particularly on a warm day, but it could all end in tragedy. **DON'T take the risk.**

THE WATER IS COLD...

...even on very warm days, rivers and canals contain water barely above 10 degrees. Sudden immersion can lead to cold water shock, which can cause gasping and intake of water.

This can be deadly in a matter of seconds.



DID YOU KNOW?

Even the narrowest of rivers can be considerably deep. Rivers are subject to strong flow and **hidden currents** which can trouble even the strongest of swimmers.

WHAT LIES BENEATH?



The water is untreated and can make you ill.

Canals and rivers contain pollutants, sewage and often unseen underwater obstructions and snag hazards.

Debris under the water such as shopping trolleys, broken glass and cans can cause **injury** or **trap** you.



Remember, there are no lifeguards to help you at your local river, lake, canal or dam.



Rivers can be very difficult to climb out of, especially with steep or slimy banks. **Stay clear of rivers with steep or unguarded banks.**



IN AN EMERGENCY...NEVER enter the water to try and help a person or animal. You could get into difficulty yourself. Instead, dial 999 and use any water rescue equipment that is available.

If you fall into the water unexpectedly, fight your instinct to thrash around. Instead, lean back, extend your arms and legs & float.

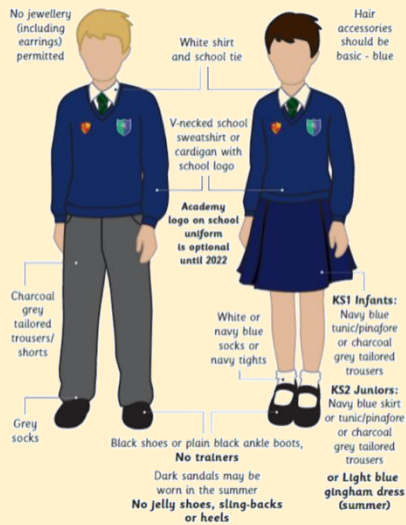
