**MINUTES**

**1. Ofsted Report Reflections**

- Parents have received and reviewed the Ofsted report.
- They expressed satisfaction that the report recognises the positive aspects of the school that they have observed.

**2. Revised Inclusion Policy Statement**

- No further comments were received following the initial input on the revised Inclusion Policy Statement.

**3. Feedback on School Meals**

- Parents appreciate having the school menu available online, enabling discussions about meals with their children.
- Concerns were raised that some children return home feeling hungry, prompting queries about portion sizes as children grow.
- Parents value the routine established by the menu.
- There was a suggestion to clarify that desserts, such as yoghurts and jelly, are sugar-free to align with healthy school initiatives.

**4. Key Priorities for Children's Experience at School**

- Parents desire for their child to be happy and confident, with visible progress in their work and enjoyment of learning. They want their child to feel proud of their accomplishments.

- A primary concern is ensuring their child feels safe, supported, and able to make good friends based on kindness and respect.
- Parents emphasised the importance of a sense of belonging within the St Ann's community, which they currently feel through participation in activities like Platform 2/Stanley Bear.
- They highlighted the need for a trusted relationship with teachers, where concerns can be raised and appreciation for the staff's efforts can be expressed.

## **5. Any Other Business (AOB)**

- **Church Car Park:**
  - Due to parking restrictions, visibility has decreased. A suggestion was made to place parking signage on the opposite side of the road.
  - The school is not permitted to place signage on the opposite side, and there are restrictions on signs placed on the school side of the road.
- **Boys' Uniform:**
  - A suggestion was made to allow boys to wear polo shirts.
  - The school clarified that polo shirts are not required as a PE uniform is already in place. On warmer days, class teachers have the discretion to allow children to remove their ties and open their top buttons.
