KS2 enjoyed a powerful performance from Altru Drama, followed by engaging workshops for our Year 6 pupils that helped deepen their understanding of how to stand up for

themselves and others. Miss Foster also led a thoughtful worship on the theme, encouraging everyone to play their part in building a supportive, caring school community.

## BOOK FAIR

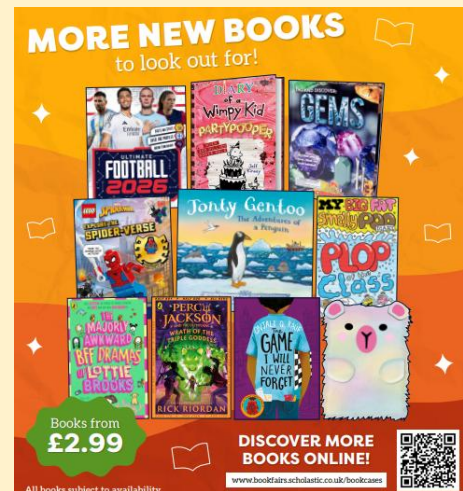

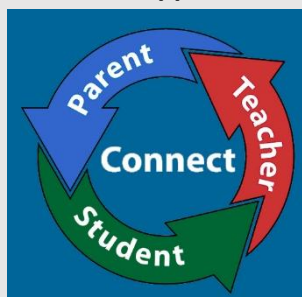


### Ways to Get Involved

Here are some effective ways you can support your child's education:

- **Engage in Daily Conversations:** Ask your child about their day at school and discuss your expectations with them before they leave home. This reinforces the importance of their education.
- **Support School Policies:** Show your child that you are aligned with school policies and procedures. This unified approach helps them understand that we are all part of the same team.
- **Establish a Reading Routine:** Make reading at home a daily expectation. This practice significantly enhances literacy skills and fosters a love for reading.
- **Encourage Homework Completion:** Ensure your child completes their homework, including accessing platforms like TT Rockstars and Numbots. Regular practice is key to their progress.
- **Attend School Events:** Participate in mentoring conversations and school events such as family worships, church services, and sports days. Your presence shows your child that education is a priority.
- **Share Bedtime Stories:** Enjoy a bedtime story together each evening. This not only strengthens your bond but also supports language development.

### Additional Opportunities for Involvement 😊



**School Committee Governors:** The School Committee is responsible for monitoring and ensuring a high-quality pupil experience that meets the needs of our local community. Parent governors are elected by the parents and carers of pupils at the academy. Any parent or registered carer of a pupil is eligible to stand for this role.

**Parent Forum:** The Parent Forum serves as an additional communication channel between home and school. This group meets once a term to celebrate our school's achievements and provide parental perspectives on agenda items. Individual matters are not addressed in this public forum. Parents can nominate themselves to be their child's Class Representative.

**Friends Association:** The Friends Association aims to raise funds that enhance the learning experiences and opportunities for all children. The funds raised through various initiatives benefit all pupils and have previously supported IT equipment, whole school events, the trim trail, and Year 6 hoodies. Everyone can contribute, whether by attending meetings, organising events, or designing promotional materials.

Opportunities include hearing readers, accompanying school trips, or assisting our staff with administrative tasks. 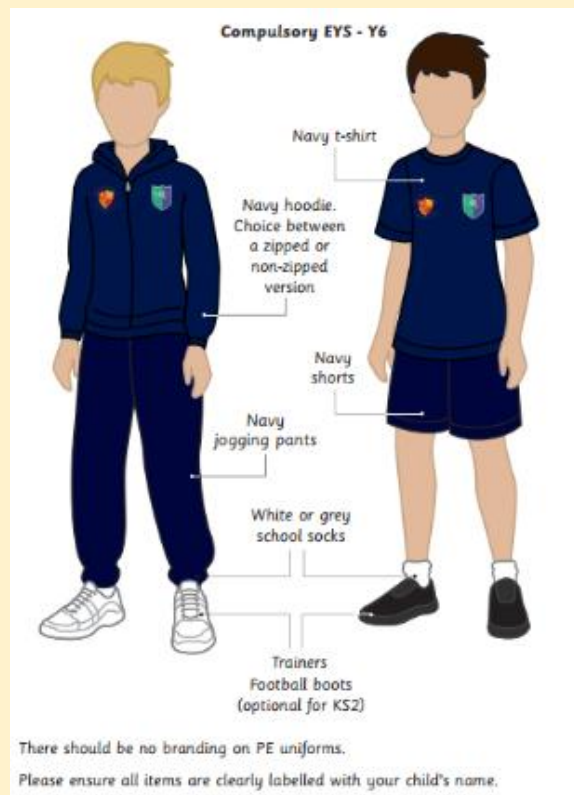
## PE KIT EXPECTATIONS

At St Ann's, children wear their PE kit to school on the days they have PE lessons. We view the PE kit as an important extension of our school uniform, and therefore, we expect the same high standards of dress to be maintained.

All children are required to wear:

- Navy blue t-shirt
- Navy blue hoody
- Navy blue shorts
- Navy blue jogging bottoms
- Trainers

These items can be plain or feature the school and Trust logo. Please note that branded sportswear is not permitted.



Additionally, trainers should only be worn on PE days and are not acceptable as everyday footwear.

If a child arrives without the correct PE kit, the school will provide suitable clothing for them to wear during the day.

## SAFEGUARDING ALERT:



### Screen Time

Did you know as an adult in the UK we check our phones on average 6 to 7 times an hour and spend over 2 hours on our phones, one way or another, every day?

Helpful pointers for our children:

1. Agree a clear set of rules and times with your child on screen time in the home. For example, dinner time, homework time and bedtime should be screen-free times.
2. Do as you say. Modelling behaviour is THE most powerful way you can influence your child's behaviour.
3. Restrict the use of computers/devices in the bedroom. Depending on the age of your child you may want to set a curfew or ban devices from the bedroom completely.
4. Try not to rely on screens too much to keep the kids amused. It can be easy to encourage kids to pick up the tablet or play a game on the computer to keep them occupied. This only confuses rules on screen time.
5. Chat to your child about what they do online and encourage them to use their screen time for learning and education.
6. Pick one evening a week where you do a family activity together, whether it's movie night, games night. Doing activities together as a family will help implement screen time guidelines and offer fun alternatives.
7. Finally, why not join in? Set some time aside to play your child's favourite computer game and discover the online world together.

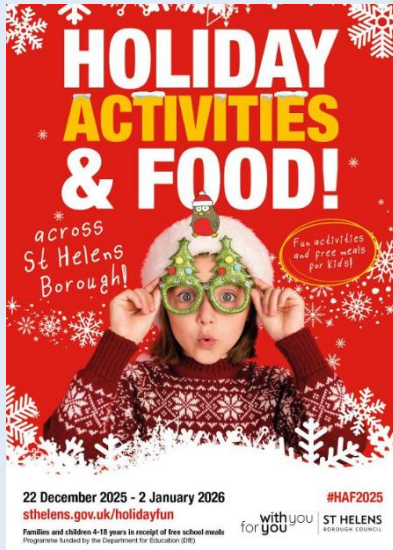

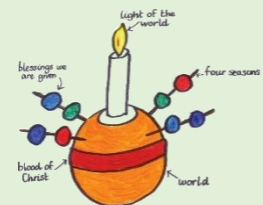

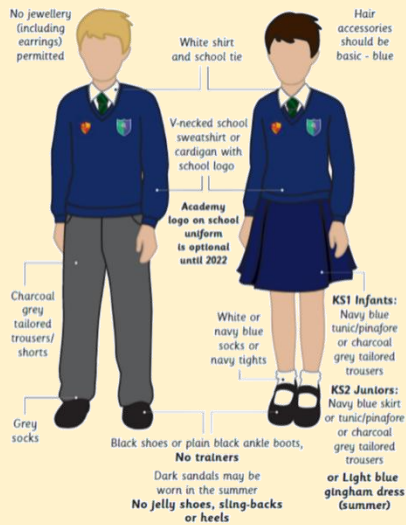

#### Pharmacy Services

Your local pharmacy can treat minor illnesses with over-the-counter treatments, and most pharmacies can also offer prescription medicine for conditions, including:

- Impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- Infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)
- Earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- Sore throat (aged 5 years and over)
- Sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)

#### GP Services

Your GP can help with common illnesses including:

- Persistent coughs
- Skin infections
- Eye infections
- Ear pain

#### Urgent treatment / walk-in centres

If your GP surgery is closed, UTCs have specialist nurses and doctors that can help. Common conditions that can be treated include:

- Cuts and scrapes
- Minor burns
- Minor breathing difficulties
- Suspected fractures
- Uncontrolled fever

#### A&E

A&E is for people with life threatening illness or injury, so if you think your child needs immediate attention, then you should attend A&E.

Conditions that require immediate attention include:

- Shortness of breath
- Seizures
- Severe bleeding or burns
- Head or eye injuries
- Allergic reactions
- Serious animal bites
- Uncontrolled pain

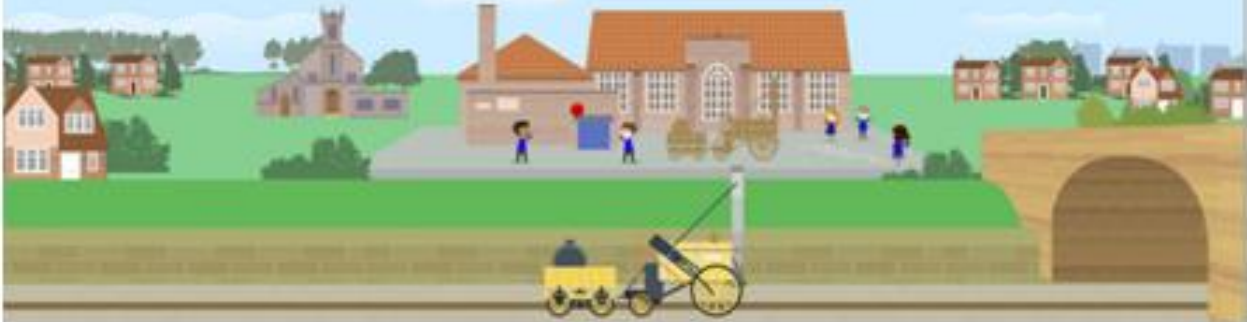
