The intent behind our Super Leaders initiative is to provide children with an opportunity to make a difference to our school, local or global community. Past projects/ campaigns have included: Rights Respecting Parliament developed a child-friendly safeguarding policy and film, Health and Safety Team promoted Road Safety, Charity Champions led on charity work to make up food hampers for local families and Food Bank, the Town Troopers have written a letter to residents about the future development of our school grounds, our Global Ambassadors made environmentally friendly reindeer food and our Equality Advocates designed a logo which is displayed in all classrooms and which celebrates equality and inclusion.

Arts Council	The Arts Council celebrates the creativity and individuality of everyone through Art. We enhance the school and local environment by producing artwork on small and large scales. Our artwork makes a real impact within our community by ringing colour, inspiration, and creativity to our environment. Each year we take part in a variety of competitions that are held on national/international levels. The Arts Council also enhance pupil wellbeing and self-esteem – everyone can be an artist!
Wellbeing Warriors	The Wellbeing Warriors, as the pupil leadership team at St Ann's CE Primary School, play a pivotal role in promoting positive mental health and wellbeing within the school community. Their primary objective is to foster an environment where all children feel supported, valued, and empowered to express their feelings. By organising activities, workshops, and awareness campaigns, the Wellbeing Warriors encourage their peers to engage in discussions about mental health, develop coping strategies, and build resilience. They serve as role models, demonstrating the importance of kindness, empathy, and mutual respect, while also acting as a bridge between students and staff to ensure that every child's voice is heard. Through their initiatives, the Wellbeing Warriors contribute significantly to creating a positive school culture that prioritises emotional wellbeing and supports the holistic development of all children.
Digital Leaders	The Digital Leaders are able to shape how technology is used both inside and outside of the classroom. Their goal is to make sure that everyone, including staff and children, are confident in keeping themselves safe online. They act as role models, helping to foster a positive digital culture by demonstrating safe online behaviours, assisting with technical challenges, and inspiring creativity through digital tools.
Health and Safety Crew	The Health and Safety Crew, plays a vital role in fostering a safe and healthy environment for all children at St Ann's CE Primary School. This team is responsible for assessing risks within the school and its surroundings, suggesting appropriate mitigations to ensure the safety of their peers. They actively promote essential road safety messages, educating fellow children about safe crossing practises and the importance of being vigilant. Additionally, the Health and Safety Crew focuses on key issues that impact children's lives, such as dog safety, sun safety, stranger danger, and water safety, ensuring that all pupils are aware of potential hazards and how to navigate them. Furthermore, the crew champions healthy lifestyle messages, encouraging their peers to adopt balanced diets and engage in regular physical exercise, thereby promoting overall well-being and resilience among the student body. Through their initiatives, the Health and Safety

Town Troopers	The Town Troopers Team is dedicated to making a positive impact in our local community. Through small but meaningful actions such as visiting care homes, assisting shoppers and delivering uplifting messages, we aim to show that even the smallest gestures can make a big difference. Charity Champions	The intent of Charity Champions is to raise awareness about the importance of donating and to inspire people to take action in support of the charities: ACE (Africa's Children in Education), Diabetes UK, and The Bobby Collieran Trust. By working closely with ACE, specifically with a school in Tanzania, we aim to make a direct, tangible difference in the lives of children who lack access to proper education. The overall goal is to encourage donations and contributions, fostering a sense of shared responsibility in supporting these causes and creating lasting positive change in communities both near and far.
Equality Advocates	The Equality Advocates aim to raise awareness and champion equality, diversity and inclusion. Through research and collaboration, the children aim to spread the importance messages of treating others with equity and embracing our differences. Through their advocacy, they empower young voices within our school to make a difference.
