EXCITING NEWS: SCHOOL MEALS COMING IN-HOUSE FROM 5 JANUARY 2026

We are delighted to announce that from Monday, 5 January 2026, St Ann's CE Primary School will be bringing our school meals service in-house. This means that we will no longer be using Mellors for our catering, but instead, our own dedicated team will prepare and serve meals right here at school.

This change brings many exciting benefits for our school community:

- **Fresh, Locally Sourced Ingredients:** We will have greater control over the quality and sourcing of ingredients, allowing us to prioritise fresh, seasonal, and locally sourced produce.
- **Tailored Menus:** Our menus will be designed specifically for the tastes and nutritional needs of our children, with a focus on balanced, healthy meals that support their learning and wellbeing.
- **Flexibility and Responsiveness:** Being in-house means we can respond quickly to feedback and dietary requirements, ensuring all children's needs are met with care and attention.
- **Stronger Community Connection:** Preparing meals on-site ourselves allows us to involve children and families more closely in the food experience, supporting our wider school values around health and wellbeing.



We want to reassure you that the price of school meals will remain the same, with no increase as a result of this change £2.75.

If your child brings a packed lunch to school, but you would like them to have a school meal instead you can arrange this by contacting the Office.

We look forward to introducing this new chapter in our school's catering and will be gathering your feedback in the near future to ensure the service meets the high standards we all expect.

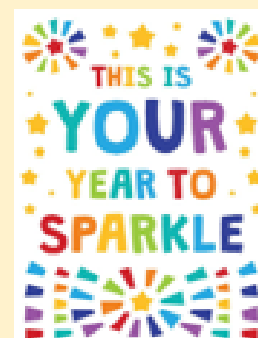

INTRODUCING: SOAR PROGRAMME



St. Ann's Outstanding Achievement Rewards

We are excited to launch SOAR – St Ann's Outstanding Achievement Rewards; our new whole-school enrichment programme.

SOAR has been developed following feedback from parents and carers and replaces Children's University. Creating our own programme allows us to recognise a wider range of learning experiences, both in and out of school, while keeping the system simple and inclusive for all families.

Children can earn SOAR hours for:

- Attending school clubs and enrichment activities
- Taking part in out-of-school clubs
- Representing the school in competitions
- Supporting the school community through leadership roles or helping at events

Parents and carers will log out-of-school activities using a simple Microsoft Form, available via the school website each half term. School-based activities will continue to be tracked by staff.

SOAR will officially launch on **Monday 5th January**. Any eligible activities completed before this date can still count towards SOAR awards and may be submitted retrospectively using the Microsoft Form.

Hours completed during previous Children's University years will be carried forward into SOAR.

To be included in the current SOAR programme year (March–March), all hours must be submitted by 28th February. Any hours submitted after this date will count towards the next SOAR programme year.

SOAR celebrates effort, commitment, leadership and learning beyond the classroom. Children will work towards SOAR awards and certificates as they accumulate hours throughout the year.

CHARACTER EDUCATION

A SPOTLIGHT ON: CHARACTER EDUCATION



Character Education encompasses the holistic personal development of a child, extending beyond academic achievements. It aims to instil essential characteristics and values such as resilience, honesty, motivation, and humility, all of which are vital for success in adult life.

At St Ann's, we are committed to nurturing our pupils' character through various meaningful initiatives, most notably:

1. Super Leaders Initiative

Super Leaders initiative pupils with the qualities necessary to thrive as responsible, respectful, and active citizens. Each child joins an advocacy team focused on effecting positive change. By the end of the academic year, these teams have made significant contributions to our school and wider community. Examples include:

- **Rights Respecting Parliament:** Developed a child-friendly safeguarding policy and film.
- **Health and Safety Team:** Promoted road safety awareness.
- **Town Troopers:** Wrote poetry for our neighbours
- **Global Ambassador:** Created environmentally friendly reindeer food for the holiday season.
- **Equality Advocates:** Designed a logo displayed in all classrooms, celebrating equality and inclusion.

Our pupils are so dedicated to citizenship that many take the initiative to raise money for charity in their own time.

2. UNICEF Rights Respecting School

As a silver UNICEF Rights Respecting School, we prioritise the promotion of equality, dignity, respect, and non-discrimination. This commitment is central to our character development efforts, reinforcing the values that underpin our community.

3. Stand Up Speak Up Week

During our Stand Up Speak Up Week, children become courageous advocates for the marginalised and fight for the rights of children globally. This week fosters confidence in making impactful changes despite adversity. Pupils engage with pressing social issues, such as climate change and women's education, through shared readings and learning about influential figures like Malala Yousafzai and Greta Thunberg. The tangible outcomes of their work reflect their strong convictions.

4. STAR Day

Our annual STAR Day encourages each year group to select a charitable cause to raise awareness and funds for. This initiative not only fosters empathy but also empowers children to take action for the greater good.

5. Inclusive Extra-Curricular Provision

We offer a wide-ranging and inclusive extra-curricular programme that provides both team and individual opportunities. These activities, led by experts in their fields, aim to challenge pupils, build knowledge, and develop skills. Success in these endeavours is acknowledged and celebrated, encouraging children to explore new interests and hone existing ones.

6. Curriculum for Behaviour

Our Curriculum for Behaviour emphasises the importance of discipline and good conduct within the school environment. We promote positive character traits through our 3Cs: **Courtesy, Care, and Concentration**, which serve as foundational principles for lifelong character development.

All children are required to wear:

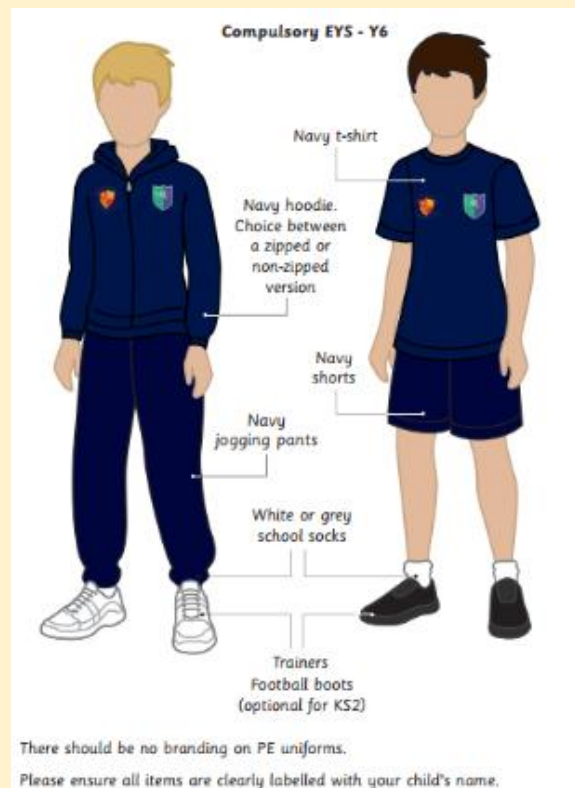
- Navy blue t-shirt

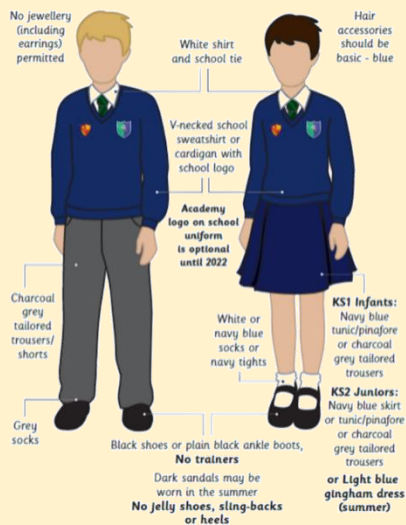

A&E

- Uncontrolled pain

GP Services

Your GP can help with common illnesses including:

- Persistent coughs
- Skin infections
- Eye infections
- Ear pain



Urgent treatment / walk-in centres

If your GP surgery is closed, UTCs have specialist nurses and doctors that can help. Common conditions that can be treated include:

- Cuts and scrapes
- Minor burns
- Minor breathing difficulties
- Suspected fractures
- Uncontrolled fever
