## A SPOTLIGHT ON: SCIENCE



### SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE

At St Ann's, we reflect the National Curriculum's belief that high-quality science education provides the foundations for understanding the world through the specific disciplines of biology, chemistry and physics and our curriculum is planned to reflect this. It is our aim that all pupils develop an enjoyment and interest in Science, learning how it contributes to all aspects of everyday life; how has changed our lives and how it is vital to the world's future prosperity. All pupils are taught essential aspects of the knowledge, methods, processes and uses of science.

Children build a body of substantive knowledge and develop ideas of key concepts through a carefully planned and sequential curriculum. Pupils are encouraged to develop a sense of excitement and curiosity about natural phenomena in the world. They are encouraged to understand how science can be used to explain what is occurring, predict how things will behave, and analyse causes, by developing their skills of scientific enquiry.

Our overall aim is to equip our children with the scientific knowledge required to understand the uses and implications of science, today and in the future so that they themselves seek out science in their everyday lives.

## SAFEGUARDING ALERT:



### Out alone

As your child gets older, it's likely they'll want a bit more independence. Going out without you is a natural step for them to take - when the time is right!

It can be hard to decide whether your child is ready. There's a lot to think about and a lot you might be worried about.

### Things to know before they go out alone:

Where do they want to go?

What do they want to do?

Who will they be with?

How far will they travel? There's a big difference between walking to the corner shop and going into town.

What time will they be out?

Consider if it's safe for them to be out late, or after dark.

There are a few basic things your child should know before they go out alone.

Their full name, address, two trusted adults' phone numbers (include the home number, if you have one), how to cross roads safely and about being aware of other children and adults when out.

### Talk to your child about what ifs

Talk to your child early on about scenarios they might face and how to stay safe. Ask them what they'd do and how they feel about them. Doing this will give you both peace of mind.

### Discuss the following what ifs with your child

A stranger tries to talk to them, or take them somewhere?

Someone they know tries to take them somewhere, without asking you?

Someone bullies them?

Someone offers them alcohol or drugs?

Someone asks them to do something they're not comfortable with?

They're stopped by the police?

Their phone battery dies? (if they have one)

They get hurt?

### Ensure you have rules and boundaries

Setting clear boundaries will help you and your child know how they should behave when you're not around. It's a good idea to agree on some rules that suit their maturity before you leave them alone. You could even write up an agreed list.

### For e.g

How far from home can they go?

How long can they stay out?

Who can they go out with or meet?

When is their agreed home time?

What activities are ok for them to do?

### **Remember**

Give your child a chance to build their independence by building your trust.

If you or your child feel uncomfortable about going out alone, why not try a group or sport club to give your child the opportunity to build their independence and be alone.

- Warm Layers - as evenings can be cool.
- Long-Sleeved Tops and Long Trousers or Leggings - jeans can become heavy when wet.
- Suitable Nightwear - for a comfortable night's sleep.
- Underwear and Socks - Pack extra pairs; ensure socks cover the ankles, as this is required for certain activities.
- Two Pairs of Trainers - One Pair for general use during the day, One Old Pair for Wet or Muddy Activities. These may not fully dry overnight, so an extra pair is advisable.
- Flipflops/crocs
- Toiletries - Including soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, and roll-on deodorant (no aerosols).
- A hat and sunscreen to guard against sun exposure.
- Warm Accessories - A woolly hat and gloves for cooler evenings.
- Reusable Water Bottle

## A Reflection from Mrs Cain

Jeremiah 22:3 calls believers to live out God's standard of justice through action. This reflects the Christian value of justice, which is rooted in God's character—fair, righteous, and compassionate. Justice in the Christian life means standing up for the vulnerable, challenging wrongdoing, and seeking fairness for all people. By rescuing those who have been treated unjustly, believers demonstrate God's love and righteousness in the world. This verse teaches that faith should lead to active concern for others, especially those suffering injustice. Living justly is therefore an important way Christians reflect God's heart and bring His goodness into society.

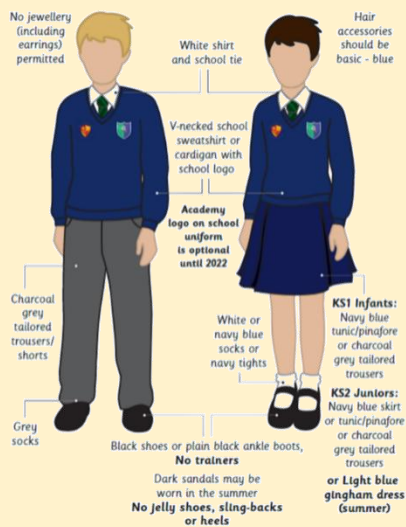

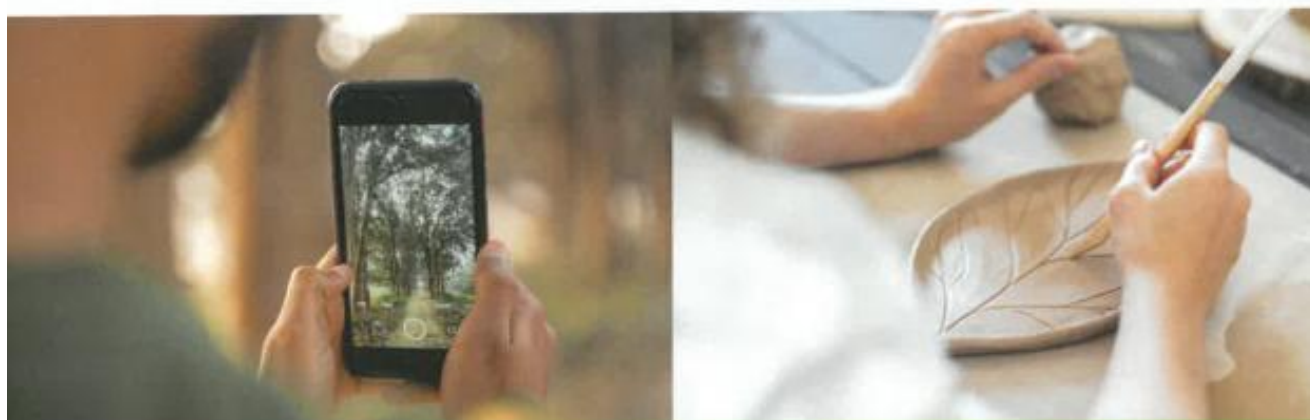
