Year 5 pupils enjoyed an action-packed “Monster Kickabout” session this week even in the adverse weather conditions, taking part in a fun-filled morning of football activities, teamwork and friendly competition. The children showed excellent sportsmanship, enthusiasm and energy throughout the event, making it a memorable experience for everyone involved. Staff praised the pupils for their positive attitude and outstanding behaviour during the session.

During the session, the children met Stephanie Roche who spent her football career in Ireland as well as representing her national team.



## A SPOTLIGHT ON: DESIGN TECHNOLOGY



All of our children at St Ann's are excited to continue their Design and Technology learning this year, building on their creativity, practical skills and understanding of the designed world.

Across the school, each year group completes three carefully planned DT projects per year. These have been developed by the curriculum lead, with support from an external Design and Technology specialist, ensuring a rich and progressive curriculum that develops knowledge and skills year on year.

A key element of our curriculum is Food and Nutrition, which is revisited in every year group. This helps children develop an understanding of where food comes from, the importance of seasonality, and how to prepare a healthy, varied and balanced diet. Other areas of DT include structures, mechanisms, electrical systems and textiles. Across all projects, the accurate use of technical vocabulary is a high priority.

Our DT curriculum is underpinned by key concepts that support creativity, problem-solving and purposeful design. Children are encouraged to consider the user and purpose of their products, ensuring their designs meet real needs. They explore functionality, focusing on making products that work effectively, and make thoughtful design decisions when selecting materials and methods. Through this, they are encouraged to show innovation, testing and refining ideas. Children also develop confidence in the selection and use of tools and equipment, enabling them to work safely and with increasing precision.

In DT, children follow a clear sequence of learning: investigating existing products, developing technical skills, and then designing, making and evaluating their own work. This supports progression in knowledge of materials, mechanisms, structures and food preparation, while also building important life skills. Strong links are made with science, mathematics and PSHE, helping children apply their learning in meaningful contexts.

This half term, children from Year 1 to Year 5 will be focusing on Food and Nutrition:

Year 1: Preparing fruit and vegetables – making salads

Year 2: Preparing fruit and vegetables – dips and dippers

Year 3: Healthy diet – designing and making sandwiches

Year 4: Healthy diet – baking scones

Year 5: Culture and seasonality – making stew

Meanwhile, Year 6 will be developing their understanding of electrical systems by designing and building fairground ride models with switches.

Through these engaging, practical projects, children are encouraged to take pride in their work, develop resilience and gain valuable skills that prepare them for future learning and everyday life.

### Y5/6 LONDON RESIDENTIAL PARENT MEETING

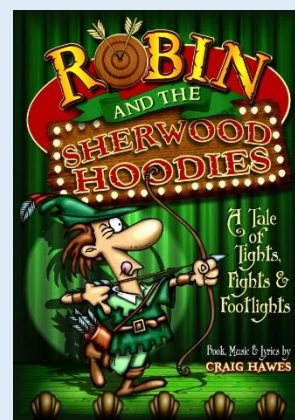

#### MARTYN'S LAW UPDATE

In light of Martyn's Law, a statutory requirement under the Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2025, all schools within the Trust have introduced additional safety measures for school events with immediate effect. To help ensure the safety of everyone attending, **bags larger than A4 size will not be permitted on site; the only exception to this will be baby bags, which will be subject to inspection by a member of school staff. #### Screen Time

Did you know as an adult in the UK we check our phones on average 6 to 7 times an hour and spend over 2 hours on our phones, one way or another, every day?

Helpful pointers for our children:

1. Agree a clear set of rules and times with your child on screen time in the home. For example, dinner time, homework time and bedtime should be screen-free times.
2. Do as you say. Modelling behaviour is THE most powerful way you can influence your child's behaviour.
3. Restrict the use of computers/devices in the bedroom. Depending on the age of your child you may want to set a curfew or ban devices from the bedroom completely.
4. Try not to rely on screens too much to keep the kids amused. It can be easy to encourage kids to pick up the tablet or play a game on the computer to keep them occupied. This only confuses rules on screen time.
5. Chat to your child about what they do online and encourage them to use their screen time for learning and education.
6. Pick one evening a week where you do a family activity together, whether it's movie night, games night. Doing activities together as a family will help implement screen time guidelines and offer fun alternatives.
7. Finally, why not join in? Set some time aside to play your child's favourite computer game and discover the online world together.

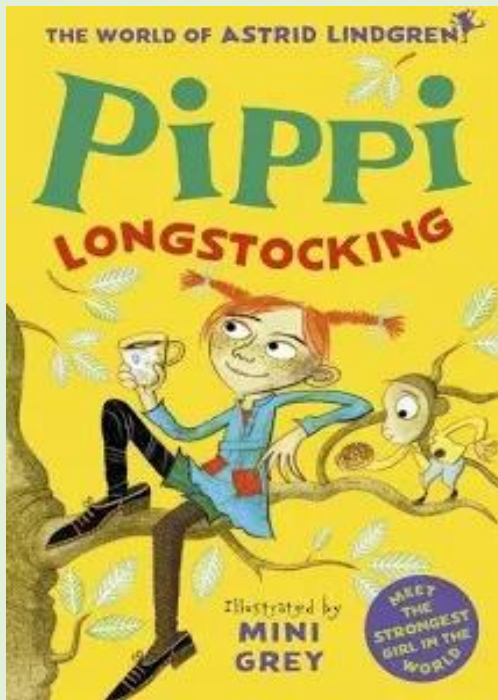
## HOMEWORK ACTIVITIES TO NURTURE YOUR CHILD'S SPIRITUAL GROWTH

### BASE SEPTEMBER 2026

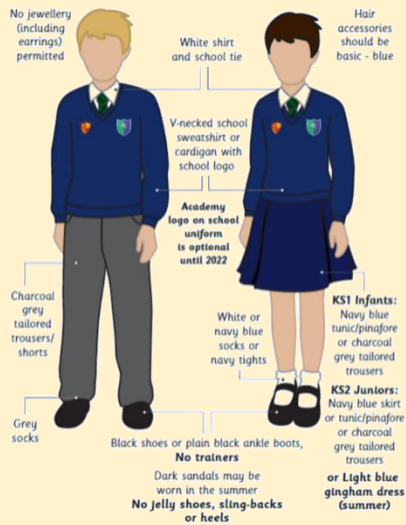
From next academic year, there will be an increase to our BASE (Breakfast and After School) provision fees. The cost of the morning session will be £5.50, and the after school session will be £10.50. This change reflects the ongoing rise in the cost of living; increases in the price index and staff wages have significantly impacted the cost of running the provision. We remain committed to providing a safe, high-quality environment for all children and appreciate your understanding and continued support.

### SCHOOL MEALS SEPTEMBER 2026

From next academic year, the cost of a school meal will be £3.00 per day. This increase has been carefully considered and reflects the ongoing rise in the cost of living. In particular, higher food prices linked to the price index, alongside increases in staff wages, have significantly raised the cost of providing meals. We remain committed to offering high-quality, nutritious lunches for all pupils and appreciate your understanding and continued support.

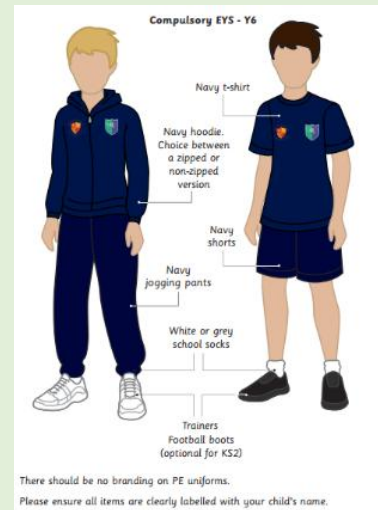
