A SPOTLIGHT ON: PHYSICAL EDUCATION



At St Ann's, every year group has two 1-hour PE sessions delivered on a weekly basis. Each class will have one session a week delivered by PECO, our specialist PE providers, and a session delivered by their class teacher. Teachers plan to cover a range of skills and sports throughout the year and our school's Long-Term Plan ensures that there is a clear progression throughout each year so that children can build on prior knowledge and skills. Our teachers use GetSet4PE as a resource to plan fun and engaging lessons for our children but will also meet with our PE specialists to discuss ideas and enhance their own professional development through personalised training to meet the needs of each class as well as the teacher.



This year has been another fantastic one for sport in our school, filled with memorable experiences and opportunities for our children. We were delighted to welcome a GB athlete, whose inspiring visit helped raise funds for new sports equipment while encouraging pupils to pursue active and healthy lifestyles. Our children have also benefited from working alongside coaches from Rainhill Cricket Club, developing their cricket skills, teamwork and confidence. These experiences, along with many sporting events and competitions throughout the year, have helped foster a love of sport and created lasting memories for our pupils.



Swimming at St Ann's is run by Volair, who assess the children on a range of skills and techniques, including: Performance of a range of strokes, swimming without aid for 25m and water survival.

We are incredibly proud to have achieved Platinum School Games Mark status for the past two consecutive years, recognising our commitment to providing high-quality sporting opportunities for all pupils. This prestigious award reflects the enthusiasm, participation and dedication shown by our children, staff and wider school community. Maintaining Platinum status highlights our ongoing commitment to promoting physical activity, competitive sport and healthy lifestyles throughout the school.

We offer a wide-range of before and after school clubs which are inclusive for every type of learner. The clubs are delivered by our PE specialists PECO and include a range of popular and more bespoke clubs. You can sign up to these clubs through Arbor at the beginning of each half-term.

WATER SAFETY

As the weather warms up, many families will be spending more time near water – whether at the coast, rivers, lakes, or canals. While this can be a great way to enjoy the outdoors, it's important to remember that water can be unpredictable and dangerous.



It's important that everyone is aware of a few simple steps to stay safe:

- Know the risks – conditions can change quickly, and it's easier than you might think to get into difficulty in open water.
- Always supervise children and young people closely around water – even if they can swim.
- Avoid jumping into unknown water – there may be hidden hazards, and sudden entry can lead to cold water shock.
- Teach children what to do if they get into trouble: Float to Live – tilt your head back, keep your ears submerged, relax and gently move your hands and feet to stay afloat while you control your breathing.
- Know how to call for help – in an emergency, dial 999 or 112 and ask for the Coastguard.
- Talking to children about water safety before visiting any location near water can make a vital difference.

MARTYN'S LAW UPDATE

In light of Martyn's Law, a statutory requirement under the Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2025, all schools within the Trust have introduced additional safety measures for school events with immediate effect. To help ensure the safety of everyone attending, **bags larger than A4 size will not be permitted on site; the only exception to this will be baby bags, which will be subject to inspection by a member of school staff. In addition, prams will not be allowed unless parents or carers consent to them being checked by a member of school staff.** We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we take these important steps to keep our school community safe.

BASE SEPTEMBER 2026

From next academic year, there will be an increase to our BASE (Breakfast and After School) provision fees. The cost of the morning session will be £5.50, and the after school session will be £10.50. This change reflects the ongoing rise in the cost of living; increases in the price index and staff wages have significantly impacted the cost of running the provision. We remain committed to providing a safe, high-quality environment for all children and appreciate your understanding and continued support.

SCHOOL MEALS SEPTEMBER 2026

From next academic year, the cost of a school meal will be £3.00 per day. This increase has been carefully considered and reflects the ongoing rise in the cost of living. In particular, higher food prices linked to the price index, alongside increases in staff wages, have significantly raised the cost of providing meals. We remain committed to offering high-quality, nutritious lunches for all pupils and appreciate your understanding and continued support.

Mental Health

How to promote good mental health with your child

- Connect with your child every day and share your own feelings.
- Ensure your child has an opportunity to have quiet time together.
- Praise your child when they do well, recognise efforts as well as achievements.
- Actively listen to your child with no distractions.
- Keep your promises, if you're not able to make sure you explain your reasons.
- Encourage your child to focus on the moment and not dwell on events.
- Practise self-care for yourself and set the standard.
- Help your child to develop a language of feelings, use stories or play together to help them to understand.

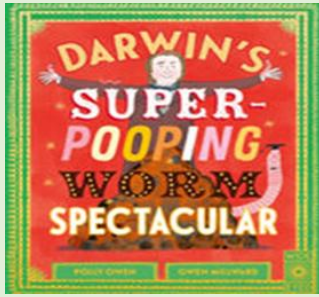
HOMEWORK ACTIVITIES TO NURTURE YOUR CHILD'S SPIRITUAL GROWTH



Light a candle (or lamp) and reflect — 3–5 mins

- EYFS: Use a lamp or LED tealight: “What makes us feel safe and calm?”
- KS1: “If this light could send a message of kindness, what would it say?”
- KS2: “Think of someone who needs hope right now. What would you say to them?”

Tip: Use battery lights for safety; keep reflections brief and gentle.

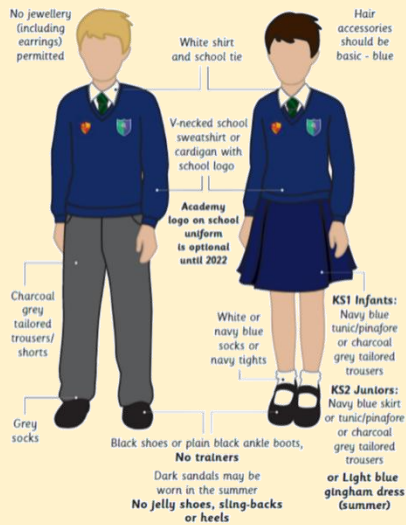




