

THE IMPORTANCE OF DAILY READING

At St Ann's Primary School, we believe that reading should be a fundamental part of childhood and a skill which should be developed to support lifelong learning.

Our aim is to develop and embed a strong, sustainable reading culture within the school community. Confident and competent readers will foster a love of reading through a rich and varied experience of texts in which they are empowered to exercise freedoms of choice and independence. Inspiring children to read is their fundamental right. It underpins all learning and secures a good trajectory for personal development and an understanding the world in which they live.

Whether you're reading a classic novel or fairy tales before bed, reading aloud to children can significantly benefit your child's life.

The impact of encouraging your child to read daily for just 15 or 20 minutes will make a significant difference to their learning in ALL subjects so please, please, please support your child in keeping it

WE ALL KNOW THIS:

A student who reads 20:00

minutes per day will be exposed to 1.8 MILLION

words per year and is more likely to score in

90th PERCENTILE on standardized tests.

A student who reads 5:00

minutes per day will be exposed to 282,000

words per year and is more likely to score in the

50th PERCENTILE on standardized tests

A student who reads

minutes per day will be exposed to 8,000

words per year and is more likely to score in the

10th PERCENTILE on standardized tests



Supporting your child at home

Questions to ask your child when you read together

When we hear children read in school, alongside their phonic skills we also support their comprehension skills.

Below you will find a list of possible questions to help you with conversations about your child's reading. They are not intended to be used all at once or every time you read with your child. Use them at your discretion and where they are appropriate. Happy reading!

Questions to ask before you read:

- Can you look at the pictures and predict what you think will happen in this book?
- · What makes you think that?
- · What characters do you think might be in our story?
- Do you think there will be a problem in this story? Why or why not?

The More that you read, the More things you will have The More that you Learn, the More places you'll go




Questions to ask during the reading:

- · What do you think will happen next?
- . What can you tell me about the story so far?
- Can you predict how the story will end?
- Why do you think the character did _____?
- What would you have done if you were the character?
- . How would you have felt if you were the character? (use different characters)
- As I read______ it made me picture_____ in my head. What pictures do

Questions to ask after reading:

- · Can you remember the title?
- In your opinion, was it a good title for this book? Why or why not?
- Were your predictions about the story correct?
- If there was a problem, did it get solved?
- What happened because of the problem?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- What is the most important point the author is trying to make in his writing?
- What was your favourite part of the story?
- If you could change one thing in the story, what would it be?
- · Can you retell the story in order?
- If you were ______ how would you have felt?


HARVEST SERVICE & DONATIONS

Year 4 will lead a Harvest Service in St Ann's Church on Friday 15th October @ 2.15pm. in line with our current risk assessment, only Y3 & Y5 will watch this service. Year 4 families are invited to watch the service also. At the end of the service, children will go back to school. Usual end of day arrangements will apply.

As part of our Harvest Service this year, Year 4 are working with 'Our Warm Welcome', a charity which works closely with asylum seekers and refugees living in St Helens. Our Warm Welcome helps to integrate asylum seekers and refugees into the community and any donations made will be used to support these families. If possible, the charity would kindly welcome donations of rice, pasta, tuna, tinned tomatoes, pulses (not baked beans) and washing tablets.
