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
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Many thanks to everyone who made a donation for Children in Need in exchange for wearing yellow today. We are delighted to share that we raised £381.95 for this very important charity.

CHRISTMAS VISITS FOR EYs & KS1



CONGRATULATIONS



CHRISTINGLE WORKSHOPS

This year we are pleased to be able to go ahead with our Christingle Family Workshops as part of our Christingle Celebration. Ahead of the Sunday Christingle Service at St Ann's Church, Reverend Alan and members of the Church will be holding workshops for the children and families of EYFS and Key Stage One. These workshops will take place on Wednesday 1st December and ONE family member of each child will be able to attend. If a family member is unable to attend the workshop children will take part with their class teacher. Times of the workshops are below.


