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
BASIC SKILLS QUALITY MARK ASSESSMENT

Number of pupils with 100% attendance this week


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Punctuality

School starts at **8.50am**. Lessons start at **8.50am**.


School gates open at 8.40am.

A SPOTLIGHT ON: PHONICS



Here at St Ann's were pride ourselves in our success in teaching our children to become successful readers who have a love for reading. We believe that every child deserves to have a strong start which is why we use the UK's leading synthetic phonics programme, Read Write Inc.

What is Read Write Inc. Phonics?

The new National Curriculum ensures that all children are phonics

systematically which is just what we do! First, we teach our children just one way of reading and spelling the English sounds. We give children a hook to learn the sounds by using pictures in the same shape as the letter.



This means that children learn to read and write sounds really easily!

Phonics Reading Books

Along with our daily phonics sessions, children then read nooks that are carefully matched to their phonics knowledge. Children are taught sounds in three sets. Once children are confident with sounds in a set, we move on to teach them more sounds in the next set. As children learn more spelling of the sounds, the books they read contain more spellings. The children will not read books that contains spellings of sounds that they do not know. This means they build confidence quickly.



Children is our school have a love for reading because Read Write Inc. and the way we teach phonics makes it easy for them. Children are taught alongside other children who are learning the same sound. They practise reading storybooks until they can read them fluently and then they bring the storybook home to read to you. They learn to form letters correctly and develop a strong handwriting style. Read Write Inc. ensures that your child learns to read and write successfully.

Helping at Home

Reading great stories aloud is the best thing you can do. Having a daily story time, reading your school book and enjoying reading for pleasure books together will support your child in making progress in phonics. Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number of times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development.


