Children across the school will be making Christmas crafts to sell during our Enterprise Week.


On **Friday 16**th **December** we would like to invite parents and carers into school, at the end of the day, to purchase Christmas crafts from their child's class.

KIDS GET THEIR SUPER POWERS BY ATTENDING SCHOOL EVERY DAY



A SPOTLIGHT ON: SCIENCE


What does Science look like at St Ann's?

At St Ann's, children are encouraged to understand how science can be used to explain what is occurring, predict how things will behave, and analyse causes, by developing their skills of scientific enquiry. As the children's knowledge and understanding increases, they are encouraged to become more proficient in selecting scientific equipment, collating and interpreting results and draw on conclusions

based on real evidence. Our engagement with the local environment ensures that children learn through varied and first-hand experiences and exposure to a diverse range of experts from the industry not only provides the children with positive role models, but also reminds them that they themselves are scientists.



NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number of times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development.

Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EY - Y2) and TTRockstars (Y2 - Y6) is the same.
