
LIVING ROOMS OF FAITH VISIT YEAR 4

Year 4 have been very lucky to have a visit from the Living Rooms of Faith. The working gave children the opportunity to engage with different faith representatives, and use personal artefacts. The workshop also gave children to the opportunity to ask questions in a relaxed and open small grouped environment to consolidate their

knowledge about other faiths. Due to the visit, Year 4 now have a much better understanding of Judaism, and know about key terms such as Menorah. They were able to learn about the history of Judaism and could compare some similar features between different religions.

A SPOTLIGHT ON: PHYSICAL EDUCATION

At St Ann's, every year group has two 1-hour PE sessions delivered on a weekly basis. Each class will have one session a week delivered by PECO, our specialist PE providers, and a session delivered by their class teacher. Teachers plan to cover a range of skills and sports throughout the year and our school's Long-Term Plan ensures that there is a clear progression throughout each year so that children can build on prior knowledge and skills. Our teachers use GetSet4PE as a resource to plan fun and engaging lessons for our children but will also meet with our PE specialists to discuss ideas and enhance their own professional development through personalised training to meet the needs of each class as well as the teacher.



Swimming at St Ann's is run by Volair, who assess the children on a range of skills and techniques, including: Performance of a range of strokes, swimming without aid for 25m and water survival.

Being a Gold School Games school for the previous four years has enabled us to begin to apply for our Platinum status. To do this we will be ensuring that we offer a wide and varied range of sport competitions that cater for all learners, which includes competitions to aspire as well as inspire our learners.



We have been extremely fortunate this year to have had the opportunity to work with a multitude of outside agencies as well as PECO. With the return of the Rugby League World Cup, we had a visit from the Tongan National side who answered questions and signed autographs before taking pictures with some of our children. Everton In The Community have also worked with our Year 3 Sports Leaders. During the session, Year 3 worked on their leadership and teamwork skills and began to think about how they may lead and adapt their own games during lunchtimes in the future.

We offer a wide-range of before and after school clubs which are inclusive for every type of learner. The clubs are delivered by our PE specialists PECO and include a range of popular and more bespoke clubs. You can sign up to these clubs through Arbor each half-term.


