

A SPOTLIGHT ON: MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Our high-quality MFL curriculum fosters pupils' curiosity, creativity and deepens children's understanding of the world. By learning Modern Foreign Languages, children develop tolerance and understanding of the world around them. Our MFL curriculum provides children with opportunities for them to understand and communicate ideas, facts and feelings in speech and writing, focused on familiar and routine matters. We aim for children's language learning to



contribute to their knowledge as global citizens and the diverse world that they will grow up in as 21st Century citizens. We want our children to be inspired by language learning and to give them confidence and good foundations so that they can build on learning in secondary school and use their skills in real life. We focus on French as it is a widely spoken language and highly accessible for our pupils, enabling them to make substantial progress in one language.

Children participate in a weekly MFL lesson in Key Stage 2 and at Key Stage 1 pupils are exposed to 30 minute sessions focusing on a wide range of songs, games and cultural activities related to the francophone world. These engaging lessons are delivered by Madame Buckley, a specialist in French. Children acquire skills and knowledge, with learning taking place in small, sequential chunks with opportunities for practice and revisiting learning. Where possible, cross-curricular links are made and additional experiences and themed days promoted, for example, European day of Languages.

The impact of our MFL curriculum is that, through careful planning and delivery, children develop a love of languages and a willingness to experiment. With time and experience, children develop confidence to speak, ask questions and communicate with others in French, giving them liberation from insularity and an opening to other cultures. Our MFL curriculum ensures all pupils develop key language learning skills set out by the national curriculum, as well as a love of languages and learning about other cultures.


