## MENTORING FORMS SPRING 2023

Children and staff are busy completing their termly assessments in preparation for our whole school mentoring conversations. Children's key data, including assessment results, will be shared with parents on our new mentoring forms. The new mentoring forms have been designed to focus on children's data for the current term and have been created based on feedback we have received from parents.

All of your child's key information for the Spring term will be included on the form, providing a clear focus for discussion during the mentoring meetings. The aim is to focus on your child's current attainment and their next steps in learning in order to ensure home and school work together to help children make good progress.

Your child's class teacher will share their mentoring form with you before your mentoring appointment. You will then be able to discuss the information shared during the meeting.




## Y5 EASTER SERVICE

## **A SPOTLIGHT ON: RSHE**

### **RSHE at St Ann's**

During the summer term, we will be delivering our Statutory Relationships and Health Education (RSHE) in PSHE lessons. Within all of our units, using the 'Jigsaw

Approach to PSHE' there are themes that focus on building healthy relationships, the rights of the child, body privacy and personal space.

Our PSHE curriculum covers all the requirements of the statutory government guidance and outcomes. Jigsaw's philosophy starts by building positive self-image, a sense of identity and a healthy relationship with self, and from that starting point helps children grow healthy relationships with others.



Our Health Education embraces not only physical health but has a strong focus on mental health and emotional literacy, empowering children to be aware of their own thoughts and feelings and know how to manage and regulate these. As always, prior to the delivery of our RHSE lessons, parents will be invited into school for a workshop that outlines the objectives covered during these lessons.

## **AN UPDATE FROM BRITISH GAS ENERGY TRUST**



British Gas Energy Trust has offered to support people to clear outstanding debts on a current or open gas, electricity or dual energy account even if not with British Gas.

To be eligible the account must be in the person's name or a person in their household and must relate to their main residence.

It is only available for people who do not have savings in excess of £1000 and who have received advice from a money advice group.

Individuals are to use the Bounce Back Checklist to assess if they are able to apply and what support they can claim for to help with payments during the cost of living crisis. After this they should speak to a local advice centres for support about their situation. Once this is done, they can approach British Gas directly to see if they are eligible for a grant. Some energy providers have their own customer trust fund, so they are to check with their own supplier to see if they can support first.



## Yes

	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


