A SPOTLIGHT ON: SCHOOL APPS

We have three home-school learning apps designed to support children with learning at home. Login details for these apps can be found in each child's reading diary.

NumBots

NumBots equips each pupil with the set of core maths skills they require by building their knowledge from the ground up - starting at the very beginning with subitising. NumBots has several settings and games for your child to play, all aimed at developing pupils' ability to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add and subtract two-digit numbers. This knowledge is vital to ensure children can access many different areas of the mathematics curriculum fluently and



confidently. When using NumBots, we recommend a 'little and often' approach; 3 minutes practice a day, 5 times a week, will make a real difference to your child's number and calculation knowledge.

Times Tables Rock Stars

Times Tables Rock Stars is a maths programme that has a proven track record of boosting children's fluency and recall in multiplication and division. Suitable for all KS2 learners, the question-based games automatically adapt



to each child's unique learning needs, helping them to recall their times tables in record speed. Accessible on any device, via the app or browser, children can play anytime, anywhere. Times Table Rock Stars has several settings and games for your child to play, all aimed at developing their times-table knowledge. This knowledge is vital to ensure children can access many different areas of the mathematics curriculum fluently and confidently. Whilst playing, children can earn virtual coins to personalise their rock avatars and move up the rock leaderboard from 'New Artist' to 'Rock Hero'! Just like NumBots, we recommend a 'little and often' approach when using TTRS; 3 minutes practice a day, 5

times a week, will make a real difference to your child's times table knowledge.

Bug Club

Bug Club is an online reading programme children can use to access a wide range of ebooks at home. The online 'Bug Club' books are carefully aligned to the book banded system used in school and match children to books that cater to their reading level. Children can use the Bug Club website to access ebooks alongside the reading books they bring home. The 'Bug 'Club' ebook collection includes a wide range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry books that include well known characters. The ebooks can be accessed on a range of devices using your child's login details. Quizzes, which help children to practise their reading skills, are also available for children to complete at the end of each book. Children can use the books on Bug Club to develop



their reading and comprehension skills, in the same way as the books sent home from school. Please indicate in their reading diary when children have read a 'Bug Club' book and completed a reading quiz.

Y6 PRODUCTION UPDATE



Rehearsals for the Y6 production are well underway with the fantastic staff of First Act. Poppy, our coach, has been working hard over the past term to develop the main chorus dances and songs with both classes and to introduce the main cast of characters in 'We Will Rock You'. From Britney Spears to Killer Queen, the children have acted out small scenes from the production to develop their characterisation and work out which roles they might like to audition for. Poppy has provided the children with audition materials to prepare for casting on the 21st April. Year 6 can't wait to rock you!


SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #5

DOMESTIC ABUSE CAMPAIGN: ACTION NEEDED IMMEDIATELY


As part of the Ask for ANI campaign, the Home Office has created a **<u>postcode checker</u>** which allows victims of **<u>domestic abuse</u>** to find their nearest participating job centre or pharmacy.

Ask for ANI (Action Needed Immediately) is a codeword scheme designed to help victims of domestic abuse access immediate help and support in a safe space.

Thousands of pharmacies and 18 job centres and benefits offices are now part of the Ask for ANI campaign and supply a safe and confidential room where those experiencing domestic abuse can reflect, access information about the support services available, and contact friends or family.




*Please note, it is no longer compulsory to wear items of clothing with the school and Trust logos on. Children may wear plain navyblue items of school uniform.
