Give yourself 15 minutes before the kids get up.


> Early to bed the night before school, especially after holidays.

A SPOTLIGHT ON:



OUR CHRISTIAN DISTINCTIVENESS AS A CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL



Our Anglican ethos is characterised by our school vision. The distinctly Christian vision for St Ann's Church of England Primary School is 'Together, we aim high; with God's love, we can fly.' This vision was agreed in 2019 following a series of workshops and gathering the voice of all stakeholders. '...But those who trust in the Lord, they will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles...' (Isaiah 40:31) was the inspiration for the vision. Our theologically rooted vision is contextually appropriate for the community we serve and ensures the school lives up to its foundation as a Church school.

As an Anglican church school we provide the following experiences for our pupils:



• encouragement of mutual respect based on Christian values, where pupils and teachers are able to talk openly and freely about their own personal beliefs and practice without fear of ridicule.

- pupils of all backgrounds to have a safe place to explore the place of doubt and certainty in a maturing faith
- pupils from Christian families to talk openly about their beliefs and values in lessons and to grow in their faith.
- pupils from other faith backgrounds to understand and be encouraged in their faith._
- opportunities to explore the experience of the Church's year.
- visits to places of worship, especially the local parish Church and the Anglican Cathedral, to develop the understanding of the Church as a living community.
- welcoming visitors from the local parish and the community to share their experience of Christian belief and life.
- liaise with the local parish to enable these visits and links to occur
- support for all pupils
- develop a deeper understanding of Christianity of a world wide faith with a range of denominations to extend children's appreciation and understanding of Worship in all its rich variety.
- confident use of religious language.
- a well-used set of Bibles in language that can be understood by the learners and examples of Bibles and prayer books from a variety of contexts.
- access to Christian artefacts that are used with care,
- respect and confidence.
- a reflection area in each classroom and several prayer spaces inside and outside school that can be used as a focus for prayer and silent reflection.
- the facility to listen to contemporary and traditional hymns and spiritual songs.
- pupils to make excellent and appropriate progress in their knowledge and understanding of Christianity.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

Y6 SATs WEEK

This year, Y6 SATs week will commence on **Tuesday 9th May** (following the bank holiday). The timetable below shows the statutory tests that all children will undertake. It is essential that your child is well rested before this week so that they have the greatest chance of achieving their potential. During the week please itself, ensure your child goes to bed at an age appropriate time and is off devices at least 1 hour before bedtime. Children must be in school each day and on time as the tests start first thing each day. Please make sure your child eats breakfast before leaving the house. Should you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's class teacher.

KS2 Year 6 SATs Dates - May 2023

Tuesday 9th May 2023	Grammar & Punctuation test - 45 minutes Spelling Test - 20 minutes

Thurs 11th May 2023	Mathematics Arithmetics (Paper 1) - 30 minutes Mathematics Reasoning (Paper 2) - 40 minutes
Friday 12th May 2023	Mathematics Reasoning (Paper 3) - 40 minutes

Parents will be given their child's scaled score and whether they have reached the expected standard set by the Department for Education ('NS' means that the expected standard was not achieved and 'AS' means the expected standard was achieved). The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test is:

- 80 (the lowest scaled score that can be awarded)
- 120 (the highest scaled score)

The expected standard for each test is a scaled score of 100 or more. If a child is awarded a scaled score of 99 or less they won't have achieved the expected standard in the test. The Department for Education expects at least 65 per cent of children to reach the expected standard.

Y2 SATs

Week commencing **Monday 15th May**, Y2 will commence their statutory assessments. Tests will be completed by the time we break up for half term. Unlike KS2 SATs, KS1 SATs don't have to be administered according to a nationally-set timetable in a specific week. Schools are free to manage the timetable and will aim to administer the tests in the classroom in a low-stress, low-key way; some children won't even be aware they've taken them!

Children will complete the following tests:

KS1 reading

The reading test for Y2 is made up of two separate papers: Paper 1 is a selection of texts totalling 400 to 700 words, with questions interspersed. Paper 2 is a reading booklet with a selection of passages totalling 800 to 1100 words. Children write their answers in a separate booklet. Each paper should take around 30 minutes, but children are not strictly timed, as the tests are not intended to assess children's ability to work at speed. The texts in the reading papers cover a range of fiction, nonfiction and poetry, and get progressively more difficult towards the end of the test. Teachers have the option to stop the test at any point that they feel is appropriate for a particular child.

KS1 maths

The Y2 maths test is made up of two papers: Paper 1 (arithmetic, worth 25 marks and taking around 15 minutes) and Paper 2 (problem-solving and reasoning, worth 35 marks and taking 35 minutes, with a break if necessary). Question types include multiple choice.

In order for children to achieve their potential it is important that children are having an age appropriate amount of sleep and are off devices at least 1 hour before bedtime. Please also ensure that your child eats breakfast before school each day.


FAMILY WORSHIP

Remember, little and often is the best way to encourage your child to use TTRS. Children should play TTRS 5 times a week for just 3 – 4 minutes a day! This will make a real difference to their times table knowledge.



SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #7

Out alone

As your child gets older, it's likely they'll want a bit more independence. Going out without you is a natural step for them to take - when the time is right!

It can be hard to decide whether your child is ready. There's a lot to think about and a lot you might be worried about.

Things to know before they go out alone:

Where do they want to go?

What do they want to do?

Who will they be with?

How far will they travel? There's a big difference between walking to the corner shop and going into town.

What time will they be out?

Consider if it's safe for them to be out late, or after dark.

There are a few basic things your child should know before they go out alone.

Their full name, address, two trusted adults' phone numbers (include the home number, if you have one), how to cross roads safely and about being aware of other children and adults when out. <u>Talk to your child about what ifs</u>

Talk to your child early on about scenarios they might face and how to stay safe. Ask them what

they'd do and how they feel about them. Doing this will give you both peace of mind.

Discuss the following what ifs with your child

A stranger tries to talk to them, or take them somewhere?

Someone they know tries to take them somewhere, without asking you?

Someone bullies them?

Someone offers them alcohol or drugs?

Someone asks them to do something they're not comfortable with?

They're stopped by the police?

Their phone battery dies? (if they have one)

They get hurt?

Ensure you have rules and boundaries

Setting clear boundaries will help you and your child know how they should behave when you're not around. It's a good idea to agree on some rules that suit their maturity before you leave them alone. You could even write up an agreed list.

<u>For e.g</u>

How far from home can they go?

How long can they stay out?

Who can they go out with or meet?

When is their agreed home time?

What activities are ok for them to do?

Remember

Give your child a chance to build their independence by building your trust.

If you or your child feel uncomfortable about going out alone, why not try a group or sport club to give your child the opportunity to build their independence and be alone.


