## Punctuality

School starts at **8.50am**.  
Lessons start at **8.50am**.

School gates open at 8.40am.

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

## YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK

Immediately following our half term holiday, all Y4 pupils will take part in the statutory times table check. The Multiplication Tables Check will be administered over a two week period starting on w/c Tuesday 6 June 2023.

Children will be tested using an on-screen check (on a computer or a tablet), where they will have to answer multiplication questions against the clock.

The test will last no longer than 5 minutes. Answers will be marked instantly. Children will have 6 seconds to answer each question in a series of 25. Each question will be worth one mark and be presented to the child in this format:

$n1 \times n2 = \underline{\quad}$  .

Questions will be selected from the 121 number facts that make up the multiplication tables from 2 to 12, with a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables as they are considered to be the most challenging. Each question will only appear once in any 25-question series, and children won't be asked to answer reversals of a question as part of the check (so if they've already answered  $3 \times 4$  they won't be asked about  $4 \times 3$ ).

Once the child has inputted their answer on the computer / device they are using, there will be a three-second pause before the next question appears. Children will be given the opportunity to practise answering questions in this format before the official check begins.

The six-second time limit per question has been decided on by the DfE because it should allow children enough time to demonstrate their recall of times tables without giving them the time to work out the answers to each question.

**Helping your child to prepare is easy! Simply ensure they access TTRockstars daily – we would recommend children play 3 games each day.**

**Watch as their score rapidly improves.**

## YEAR 1 PHONICS CHECK

School will administer the Phonics Screening Check the week beginning Monday 12 June 2023 to all Y1 pupils and to Y2 pupils who failed the check in December.

The Phonics Screening Check shows how well your child can use the phonics skills they've learned, and to identify children who need extra phonics help.

The checks consist of **40 words and non-words** that your child will be asked to read one-on-one with a teacher. Non-words (or nonsense words, or pseudo words) are a collection of letters that will follow phonics rules your child has been taught, but don't mean anything – your child will need to read these with the correct sounds to show that they understand the phonics rules behind them.

You can download the Department for Education's official [Year 1 Phonics screening check past paper from 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 & 2022](#) to get an idea of what your child will be asked to do.

Your child will be scored against a national standard, and the main result will be whether or not they fall below, within or above this standard.

You can help your child prepare for their Phonics Screening Check by going over the phonics they've learned in Reception and Year 1. Read new books and stories with them where they will be introduced to new words that they'll have to sound out, and [review the phonics sounds and rules](#).

As always, if you have any questions regarding the check, simply speak to your child's class teacher.

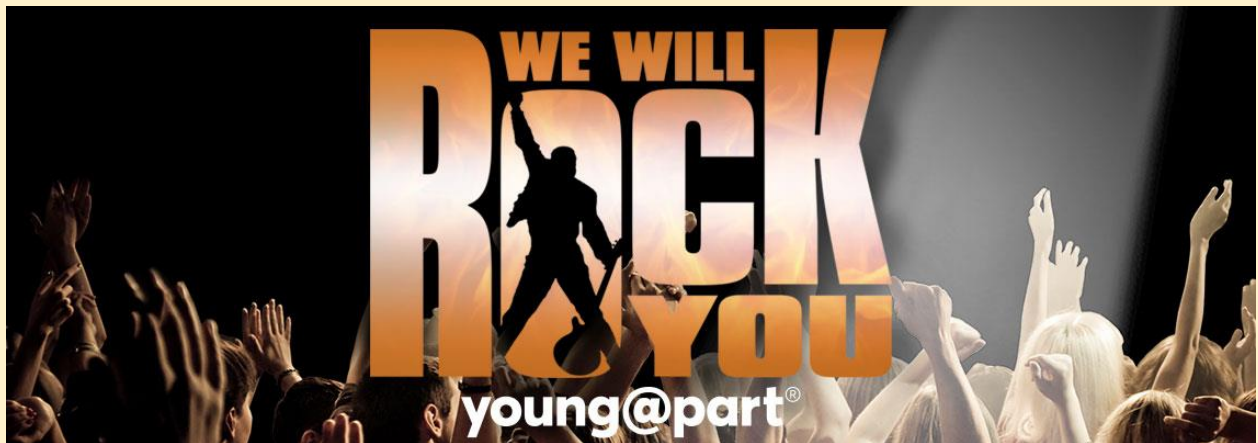

## A SPOTLIGHT ON: SPIRITUALITY



At St Ann's Church of England Primary School, spirituality is understood as our relationships with each other and God. It is an act of being fully human and discovering and revealing ourselves through love. Having a shared understanding amongst the community means individuals' spirituality can be nurtured. This understanding is explored and experienced during collective worship through our

Anglican practices. Most typically this includes through the Bible stories that are re-told (including through song), the stillness, prayers and the personal reflections shared. Providing the time and opportunity for children to relive their stories and reflect on why they are valuable to them, allows the children to express an emotional reaction to their personal experiences. The ability to live the emotion again, in the retelling of a significant moment, provides the means for children to move to the land of the spirit. And at the heart of the vast majority of their stories, is love. This is often revealed through four aspects; awareness of self, their relationship with others, a response to the beauty of the natural world and exploration of the beyond. Asking the questions 'What would Jesus do?' or 'Who would Jesus be?' demands children to consider the nature of our 'being' and the values and virtues we are living out. A moment of stillness makes space for just 'being,' for noticing and encourages everyone to be present to the self, to others, to the world and to the divine.

### Spiritual development is an intrinsic part of the curriculum in the following ways:

- Daily act of collective worship designed to nurture everyone's spiritual development through story, song, prayer, reflection, symbols, natural objects
- Regular Worship through Song led by Church choir director
- Half termly pupil led collective worship
- Weekly RE lessons which offer an opportunity for reflection
- Half termly church services
- KS2 Communion services
- Y5 & 6 Confirmation classes
- Spontaneous prayer or action in response to personal, local, national and global events e.g. sending cards to the library, get well messages to pupils who are in hospital
- Regular writing of prayers which are displayed as an outward expression of our love e.g. war in Ukraine, death of Queen Elizabeth II, Coronation of King Charles III
- Prayer spaces in every classroom and other central places
- Awe and wonder moments throughout the curriculum e.g. Literature shared during English lessons, PSHE lessons promoting mindfulness or use of debate, Natural Disasters Geography unit in Y6, growth in Science, study of visual arts in Art & Design



- Opportunity to visit external places that nurture pupils' cultural development through our Cultural Offer
- Focus Weeks, including Stand Up Speak Up week
- Shared experiences e.g. Jubilee family picnic, STAR day – charity fund raising day, Christingle & bunting making Workshops
- Outdoor learning e.g. in woodland
- Celebrations e.g. talent show, Worship through Praise, school production, birthday cards from school, texts/ emails of praise

## **SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #10**

### **Keeping your children active**

Children need food to provide energy and the essential nutrients to help them grow physically, as well as lots of activity and opportunities to develop their sense of self and self-worth.

Habits established at a young age will last, and will help prevent future health issues such as heart disease, diabetes, obesity and poor mental health.

### **Get active**

It is recommended that children aim to have 60 minutes of activity a day. Being more active can:

- improve behaviour
- raise self-esteem
- support development of good social skills
- improve sleep patterns
- strengthen muscles and bones
- support and improve coordination

### **Activities to try with your child:**

- Family walks. You can make these more interesting by creating a treasure hunt with things for your child to spot on the way.
- Swimming together. Many pools have family sessions with in-pool activities.
- You can get active in the garden – get creative.
- If your child has a games console, look for games that get them physically active and that you can join in with.

The [Change4Life website](#) has great ideas for activities both indoors and outdoors.

### **Be your child's role model**

- Get moving with your children - going for a family walk, going to the local park or playing in the garden are great ways of having some family time.
- Chose healthy snacks and treats.
- Reward your child's positive choices and behaviour with your time and attention. Your children will love it!
- Eat together as a family, without distractions from phones or tablets.
- Get cooking together – children are more likely to try new foods if they have helped to prepare them.

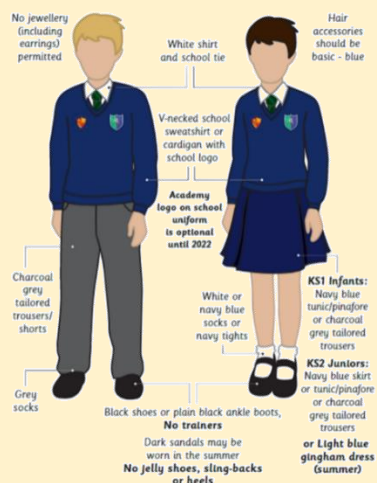
### **Sleep**

At age 4 your child will need about 11.5 hours sleep a night. By the age of 8 they still need about 10 hours 15 minutes! Establishing good bedtime routines are essential and making sure your child has time to relax before bed can aid a good night's sleep.
