EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS TIPS FOR PARENTS BY PARENTS

Don't give in! Follow through. Be organised! Get everything ready from the night before. Have their coats and bags at the door, their lunch made and their clothes on the banisters.

Punctuality

School starts at **8.50am**. Lessons start at **8.50am**.

School gates open at 8.40am.

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK

Immediately following our half term holiday, all Y4 pupils will take part in the statutory times table check. The Multiplication Tables Check will be administered over a two week period starting on w/c Tuesday 6 June 2023.

Children will be tested using an on-screen check (on a computer or a tablet), where they will have to answer multiplication questions against the clock.

The test will last no longer than 5 minutes. Answers will be marked instantly. Children will have 6 seconds to answer each question in a series of 25. Each question will be worth one mark and be presented to the child in this format:

n1 x n2 = ____

Questions will be selected from the 121 number facts that make up the multiplication tables from 2 to 12, with a particular focus on the 6, 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables as they are considered to be the most challenging. Each question will only appear once in any 25-question series, and children won't be asked to answer reversals of a question as part of the check (so if they've already answered 3 x 4 they won't be asked about 4 x 3).

Once the child has inputted their answer on the computer / device they are using, there will be a three-second pause before the next question appears. Children will be given the opportunity to practise answering questions in this format before the official check begins.

The six-second time limit per question has been decided on by the DfE because it should allow children enough time to demonstrate their recall of times tables without giving them the time to work out the answers to each question.

Helping your child to prepare is easy! Simply ensure they access TTRockstars daily – we would recommend children play 3 games each day.

Watch as their score rapidly improves.

YEAR 1 PHONICS CHECK

School will administer the Phonics Screening Check the week beginning Monday 12 June 2023 to all Y1 pupils and to Y2 pupils who failed the check in December.

The Phonics Screening Check shows how well your child can use the phonics skills they've learned, and to identify children who need extra phonics help.

The checks consist of **40 words and non-words** that your child will be asked to read one-on-one with a teacher. Non-words (or nonsense words, or pseudo words) are a collection of letters that will follow phonics rules your child has been taught, but don't mean anything – your child will need to read these with the correct sounds to show that they understand the phonics rules behind them.

You can download the Department for Education's official Year 1 Phonics screening check past paper from 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 & 2022 to get an idea of what your child will be asked to do.

Your child will be scored against a national standard, and the main result will be whether or not they fall below, within or above this standard.

You can help your child prepare for their Phonics Screening Check by going over the phonics they've learned in Reception and Year 1. Read new books and stories with them where they will be introduced to new words that they'll have to sound out, and review the phonics sounds and rules.

As always, if you have any questions regarding the check, simply speak to your child's class teacher.

A SPOTLIGHT ON: CHARACTER EDUCATION

At St Ann's **pupils' character** is developed in numerous meaningful ways but most notably through the following examples:

- Our **Super Leaders** initiative gives pupils the qualities they need to flourish in society by teaching them to be responsible, respectful and active citizens in public life. It is instrumental to our character education offer. Each child is a member of an advocacy team which campaigns for change. By the end of each academic year, each team has made a difference to our school, local or global community e.g. Rights Respecting Parliament developed a child-friendly safeguarding policy and film, Health and Safety Team have promoted Road Safety, Town Troopers have led on charity work to make up food hampers for local families and Food Bank, our Eco Warriors made environmentally friendly reindeer food and our Equality Advocates designed a logo which is displayed in all classrooms and which celebrates equality and inclusion. Our pupils take citizenship so seriously that many raise money for charity in their own time.
- We are a silver UNICEF Rights Respecting School (soon to be Gold). This is central to developing
 pupils' character as the promotion of equality, dignity, respect and non-discrimination lie at the
 heart of achieving the award.
- During Stand Up Speak Up Week children become courageous advocates, standing up for the poor, marginalised or the rights of children globally. The aim of the week is to create the confidence that we can make a real change in the face of adversity. During SUSU Weeks, children have studied social issues such as climate change and the education of women. Stimuli for the week has been a whole school shared book or learning about children around the world who have been agents of change such as Malala or Greta Thunberg. Tangible outcomes of the children's work have shown the children to be strong in their convictions.
- **STAR Day** is our annual charity fundraising day whereby each year group chooses a charitable cause to raise awareness of and fund-raise for.



YEAR 4 COMPETITION

We are thrilled to announce our Times Tables Challenge!

We firmly believe that practising times tables regularly is crucial for your child's mathematical development, and will support them in the upcoming Multiplication Check. It helps them build fluency, accuracy, and confidence in solving mathematical problems. To encourage and motivate our students, we have decided to introduce a fun incentive challenge.

Starting from Monday 15th May, if your child commits to practising their times tables on Times Table Rockstars every day for the duration of four weeks up until Monday 12th June, they will be eligible to enter a draw for a chance to win a cinema voucher! This reward not only acknowledges their hard work but also provides an opportunity for a fun-filled family outing.

We believe this incentive program will not only make the learning process more enjoyable for your child but also provide them with a sense of achievement and motivation. It is essential to emphasise that the true reward lies in the improved mathematical skills they will gain through consistent practice.

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics




