

Give yourself 15 minutes before the kids get up.


> Early to bed the night before school, especially after holidays.


A SPOTLIGHT ON: HOW PARENTS/ CARERS CAN SUPPORT OUR SCHOOL

At St Ann's we work hard to engage with our families because we know there is a direct link between parental involvement in a child's education and how happy and successful a child is.

Ways everyone can be involved:

- Asking your child about their day at school and reminding them of your expectations for them before they leave the house
- Showing your child you support school policies and procedures so they know we are a team and there is one clear message
- Making reading at home EVERY day the expectation
- Ensuring they complete their homework including accessing TT Rockstars & Numbots
- Attending mentoring conversations and other school events e.g. family worships, church services, sports days
- Complete requests for information by the given deadline to support the school in running efficiently
- Sharing a bedtime story each evening

SCHOOL COMMITTEE GOVERNORS

The School committee takes responsibility for monitoring and ensuring a high quality pupil experience, which meets the needs of the local community. Parent governors are elected by the parents and carers of pupils at the academy/school. Any parent or registered carer of a pupil is eligible to put themselves forward for the role.

PARENT FORUM

The purpose of the Parent Forum is to provide another channel of communication between home and school. The group meet to celebrate the work of our school and to offer a parental perspective on agenda items. The forum meets once a term and they are supported by the school's senior leadership team. Individual matters are not addressed at Parent Forum as this is a public forum that only meets once a term. Parents nominate themselves to be their child's Class Rep.

FRIENDS ASSOCIATION

The goal of the Friends Association is to raise funds to help enhance and further the children's learning experiences and opportunities. Funds benefit all the children and come from the fundraising initiatives and events that will be held during the school year. Over the years, the Friends Association have funded IT equipment, whole school events, the trim trail and Y6 Hoodies. Everyone has something to give whether that is attending a meeting, setting up an event or designing a poster..

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #12



Transition

Young people go through all kinds of changes as they grow up, including when they move into a new class, go to secondary school, move to a new house or area, or experience changes within their family. These times of transition can be exciting. However, they can also be stressful, worrying or upsetting.

Change can be difficult when a young person does not want it to happen or does not feel ready for it, feels worried about something new or unknown, needs time to let go of something that has ended or feels that what is happening to them is out of their control. A child or young person may also find change difficult if they are already struggling with other things.

Signs your child may be struggling with change

Look out for a change in things like sleeping or eating habits. Communicate with your child if you've seen these signs. Keep going, even if it feels like you're not getting through to them. Contact your GP or school about the warning signs if things don't improve.

What to do if your child is finding change difficult

Be part of the solution

As a parent, be part of the solution. There are a number of things you can do to support your child, whether that be helping them plan, problem-solve, or develop a sense of hope for the future. Jo's tips:

Get interested in what your child is doing.

Open up conversations about what they're involved in.

Keep an eye on pressure points.

Looking after yourself as a parent

It's important you look after yourself so you can best look after your child. Catherine's tips: Recognise when you're finding things hard. Talk to family and friends about how things are. Don't blame yourself - it is not your fault. Recharge your batteries and relax.

Yes	
	Until
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


