

EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS TIPS FOR PARENTS BY PARENTS

Don't give in! Follow through. Be organised! Get everything ready from the night before. Have their coats and bags at the door, their lunch made and their clothes on the banisters.

Treat it like a military operation in the morning! Don't give them a choice to stay at home.

Give yourself 15 minutes before the kids get up. No TV, iPad or phones allowed in the morning.

Keep talking about the importance of school.

Early to bed the night before school, especially after holidays.

Know how many days your child has

missed in school.

Come back to school

after doctor/ dentist

appointments.

OPPORTUNITY FOR PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT WITH SAFEGUARDING PROJECT



The Police say that children possessing and sharing indecent images is a growing problem that they have to deal with. However, when the police become involved in a situation in which children are sharing images the impact on a family can be traumatic. This is not the impact that the police are trying to achieve and they have asked Ariel Trust to speak to parents about different ways to tackle this issue.

Paul Ainsworth, from Ariel Trust, would like to meet with parents to discuss some ideas. He will have some ideas for a film that he would like to test out but he would also like to listen to parents' experiences. The whole process will be confidential and anyone taking part will have the chance to influence the way resources for primary schools are delivered across Merseyside.

CHOIR EVENT





A SPOTLIGHT ON: TRANSITION





Our current Y6 pupils leaving us to go to Rainhill High School in September will attend their transition days at their new school too. All other Y6 pupils should attend St Ann's as normal. They will act as 'special helpers' across the school.

RATIONALE FOR TRANSITION DAYS

Our transition days will be an opportunity for the children to experience what it will be like in their new year group. They will follow the routine of their class, including coming in through their new classroom doors, meet the staff that will be working in their class and have an opportunity to complete a variety of lessons. Transition days allow children and staff to start to build relationships and get to know each other. This can help alleviate any concerns children may have about moving up and ensure the start of the new school year is an exciting and positive experience for everyone.

CREATING OUR YEAR 1 CLASSES

In line with our school procedure, our current EYFS classes will be reviewed in preparation for the children transitioning to Year 1 in September. The classes that are created at the end of EYFS usually remain the same throughout the rest of your child's time at St Ann's, although this is not always the case. New classes are created based on staff's knowledge of all the children, having taught them for the full school year. You will find out your child's class on Friday 30 June.

TRANSITION FOR NEW STARTERS IN OUR EARLY YEARS

Starting school at St Ann's does not just take place on the first day of the new school year in September. In fact, lots of time is spent during the summer term, before children start school, preparing them for their first day! Children starting school with us in the EYFS take part in drop-in sessions, where they can come and meet the staff and explore our setting. They attend transition sessions and parents attend a New Parents Meeting, receiving lots of information about school life and the Early Years curriculum. Our staff visit the children's pre-school settings and have conversations with their key teacher. Finally, our teachers hold individual telephone conversations with each and every parent so that we get to know the children before they even arrive \bigcirc

TRANSITION FOR PUPILS WITH ADDITIONAL NEEDS

For our students with additional needs, we understand how important it is that our children are prepared well in advance for transition. Teachers and support staff work closely to complete a

'Transition Support Plan' which ensures that children have the opportunity to experience aspects of their new year group before our transition days. Children will go on messages to their new classroom, look closely at where their things will go and take part in Storytime with their new class teacher once they are announced. Children with additional needs will also bring home a transition booklet to read over the summer to familiarise themselves with their new class and teaching staff.

(followed by disco, to finish approximately 8.00pm)


7.00pm: EYs-Y5 Awards Evening Invitation only






CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY CEREMONY

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Threadworms	Slapped cheek




