

TIPS FOR PARENTS BY PARENTS

Don't give in! Follow through. Be organised! Get everything ready from the night before. Have their coats and bags at the door, their lunch made and their clothes on the banisters.

Treat it like a military operation in the morning! Don't give them a choice to stay at home.

Give yourself 15 minutes before the kids get up. No TV, iPad or phones allowed in the morning.

Keep talking about the importance of school.

Early to bed the night before school, especially after holidays. Come back to school after doctor/ dentist appointments.

Know how many days your child has missed in school.

PUPIL SELF CARE OVER THE SUMMER (SEE ATTACHEMENT TO NEWSLETTER)



Just as we look after our physical health, it's important to look after our mental health.

Self-care is all about what you can do to help yourself feel better or to keep yourself feeling good. It's a way that we can look after our own mental health and wellbeing. It can help your body and mind to relax, drift away, or be more energised.

This self-care plan walks primary-aged children through a series of steps, helping them create a simple self-care plan that works for them. It helps children identify activities that they can use to support their mental health.

Some of the suggested self-care activities include: music and dance, mindfulness and art.

The resource was co-written by Anna Freud Centre experts and young people, who shared ideas on self-care strategies that work for them.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE



Your child is invited to sign up for this year's Summer Reading Challenge. Sign up at your local library!

What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays – and to enjoy anything they like to read! Children aged 4-11 are invited to set a reading goal, and collect rewards for their reading.

It's **FREE** to take part, and last year 75% of children taking part improved their reading skills over the holidays.¹

Why should my child sign up?

- They will be **better prepared to return to school** in the autumn.
- The Challenge supports the move into a new year group.
- Becoming more independent in their reading boosts children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The library provides free access to books and fun family activities all through the summer.
- Library staff are on hand to offer support and book recommendations.

Your child will be part of a UK-wide programme developed by <u>The Reading Agency</u> and delivered in partnership with the <u>public library network</u>.

How can my child take part? (Library OR online)

In the library. Visit your local library and sign up. Your child will:

- Set a reading goal for the summer and borrow and read books, eBooks and audiobooks. Your child can choose anything they like to read!
- Receive a Challenge folder and collect special stickers and rewards for reading.

OR

Online. Take part online at summerreadingchallenge.org.uk

- Sign up on the official Challenge website.
- Set a reading goal and get tips for accessing books for free at home.
- Unlock digital badges and online rewards, including a printable certificate.

When?

Throughout the **summer holidays.** Check with your local library to find out start & finish dates near you. Unsure where your closest library is? Use the <u>Library Finder</u> to check. Head to your local library this summer and sign up!

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #16

Virtual Reality

What is virtual reality VR?

VR is a relatively new technology that allows users to fully immerse themselves in a virtual, computer generated world. Users can use headsets to transport themselves to different settings, ranging from realistic cities or locations, to spaceships or a favourite game or movie.

VR headsets are becoming more widely available, and there is even new equipment out there that allows users to touch and feel things in VR too.

Does VR have an age restriction?

Many VR headsets have a minimum age restriction of 13 years old – this is due to a range of physical and legal restrictions around using this technology.

VR headsets need to take in and process information about us, like where we move and what we look at, for them to work. They also collect data on how long we look at things, ideas about our height and how much our pupils dilate when looking at different things.

It is illegal for companies to collect this data from under 13s in the UK without parental consent, which is why the minimum age to use most VR headset is 13 years old.



child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooning Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


