

#### **DENTAL EXAMINATIONS FOR RECEPTION & YEAR 1 CHILDREN**

The Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) and St Helens Local Authority are undertaking a dental survey of 5 year old children in schools across England. The survey provides information on the oral health of children and aims to support actions to improve oral health, reduce health inequalities and improve the provision of treatment services.

The dental survey is commissioned by St Helens local authority and involves a dental examination of selected reception and year 1 children. The survey will take place at St Ann's on **Tuesday 7 November 2023.** 

Having a healthy mouth is important to overall health and wellbeing. Children who have tooth decay may have pain, infections, difficulties with eating, sleeping and socialising and may require time off school for dental treatment.

Oral health is therefore an important aspect of a child's overall health status and of their school readiness. Oral health is seen as a marker of wider health and social care issues including poor nutrition and obesity. Interventions that reduce sugar intake have the potential to impact tooth decay and obesity because high intakes of free-sugars are known risk factors for both.

## A SPOTLIGHT ON PHONICS





At St Ann's, we believe that every child deserves to have a strong start to reading, learning the skills required to decode and understand texts. To support children in developing these early reading skills, we teach phonics using 'Read Write Inc', a Department for Education approved synthetic phonics programme. Read Write Inc teaches children sounds in

English, the letters that represent them, and how to form the letters when writing.

#### What is Read Write Inc. Phonics?

RWI is an early phonics and reading programme that provides a structured and systematic approach to teaching phonics and early literacy. It follows an interactive approach which includes a number of short tasks so that children are involved and engaged throughout the whole session. It is designed to create fluent, independent readers, confident speakers, independent spellers and willing writers. The National Curriculum states that all children should be taught phonics systematically. Read Write Inc, ensures that our phonics teaching follows a systematic progression that allows our children to develop a secure knowledge of the sounds each letter or combination of letters makes. This sound knowledge can they be used by children to read new words and to spell new words when writing.

RWI links phonics with reading and writing. During a typical RWI session, children will learn a new letter sound and practise reading words containing that sound. They will learn the formation of the letters and write words using the new taught sound with an emphasis on spelling. Following this, children are introduced to their book for the session which is linked to the new letter sounds learnt.

#### **Phonics Reading Books**

Children read books that are carefully matched to their phonics knowledge and the sounds they have learnt in their phonics session. The children will not read books that contain spellings of sounds that they do not know. This means they build confidence quickly and become independent readers. They are taught reading strategies that they can employ in their reading of the text and work with their reading partner to read through the books.

Children practise reading their phonics books until they can read them fluently and then they bring the book home to read to you. They learn to form letters correctly and develop a strong handwriting style. Read Write Inc. ensures that your child learns to read and write successfully.

#### **Helping at Home**

Reading great stories aloud is the best thing you can do to support your child. Having a daily story time, reading your school book and enjoying books together will support your child in making progress in phonics.

Want to find out more about how your child in taught? The come along to our Parent Insight sessions! This time, the focus is on Maths.

#### **EY PARENT INSIGHT**

#### **SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #6**

#### **Neglect**

Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a child's basic needs and is the most common form of child abuse.

A child may be left hungry or dirty, without adequate clothing, shelter, supervision, medical or health care.

A child may be put in danger or not protected from physical or emotional harm.

They may not get the love, care and attention they need from their parents.

A child who's neglected will often suffer from other abuse as well. Neglect is dangerous and can cause serious, long-term damage - even death.

Research shows that 1 in 10 children have experienced neglect across the UK. Neglect was identified as a factor in 82,950 assessments completed by social workers in 2021/22. 24,430 children across England were on a child protection plan because of neglect in 2021/22.


