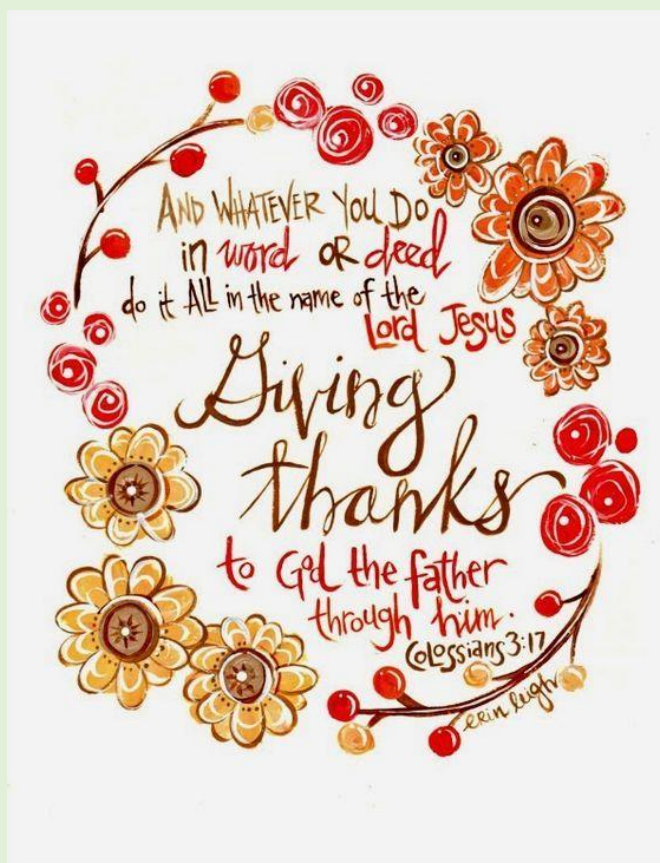

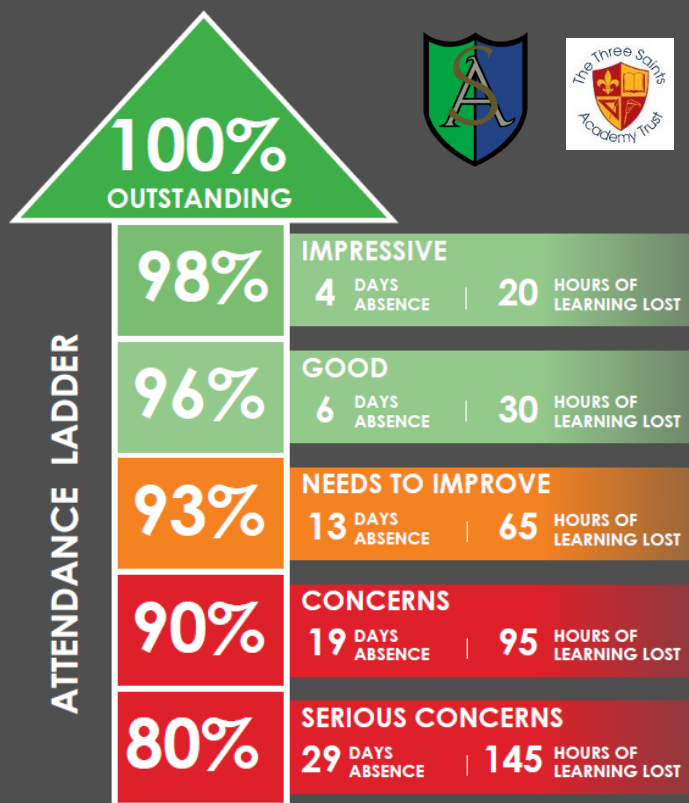
School starts at **8.50am**.

SWIMMING 2023-24

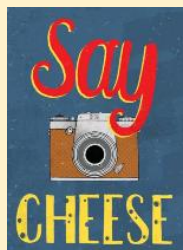


6M will swim at Halewood Volair on the following dates: **24th, 25th & 26th October 2023.**

DENTAL EXAMINATIONS FOR RECEPTION & YEAR 1 CHILDREN

The Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) and St Helens Local Authority are undertaking a dental survey of 5 year old children in schools across England. The survey provides information on the oral health of children and aims to support actions to improve oral health, reduce health inequalities and improve the provision of treatment services.

The dental survey is commissioned by St Helens local authority and involves a dental examination of selected reception and year 1 children. The survey will take place at St Ann's on **Tuesday 7th November 2023**.

Having a healthy mouth is important to overall health and wellbeing. Children who have tooth decay may have pain, infections, difficulties with eating, sleeping and socialising and may require time off school for dental treatment.

Oral health is therefore an important aspect of a child's overall health status and of their school readiness. Oral health is seen as a marker of wider health and social care issues including poor nutrition and obesity. Interventions that reduce sugar intake have the potential to impact tooth decay and obesity because high intakes of free-sugars are known risk factors for both.

A SPOTLIGHT ON SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS



What is SEND Provision?

SEND is an acronym for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. As a school, we cater for all children no matter their need or individual disability. Here at St Ann's, we include all children as part of our school family and celebrate differences of all kinds. Our aims for children with SEND are the same as for all the other children in our care, but we recognise that we may have to adapt the methods of teaching and the pace of learning for these children to take account of their needs. To do this we:

- identify the child's needs
- inform all interested parties
- record and monitor the effectiveness of any action taken
- ensure that the curriculum can be adapted for meeting the needs of all children
- develop an atmosphere of encouragement, acceptance and respect for all learners



What does this look like?

We understand that children learn and develop in different ways. Teachers and teaching assistants recognise this and use different teaching styles, resources and plan different levels of work in the classroom, to cater for the various ways that children learn. However, many children, at some time in their school life need extra help. For pupils identified with additional needs we look closely at what additional support will help them achieve their full potential as part of a fully inclusive learning environment. Here are some ways we do this:

- working with outside agencies to provide effective strategies for example: LASC training, Trauma Informed Approach Training and Physical Intervention.
- purchase equipment that supports children with additional needs for example: coloured over lays, pencil grips or fidget toys
- intervention programmes such as IDL and Reading Plus

Our aim is to work with parents/carers and pupils to listen to what is needed so we can offer a fully inclusive learning environment. We welcome ideas and input from home. A close working partnership helps us provide the best support for our SEND pupils.

What does our Provision consist of?

The main methods of provision made by St Ann's are:

- all teachers providing clear 'Access Strategies' for those learners who need subtle adaptations - implementing a 'bespoke curriculum' for certain learners
- full time education in classes, with additional help and support by class teacher/teaching assistant
- individual timetables that address individual needs and outcomes
- small group/individual work with a Teaching Assistant
- access to our Sensory Room
- Therapeutic intervention and access to the Rainbow Room
- movement breaks or implementation of Sensory Diets
- - termly conversations with class teacher to discuss child's Support Snapshot/Plan

SAFGUARDING TOP TIP #7

**Keeping

Screen Time

Did you know as an adult in the UK we check our phones on average 6 to 7 times an hour and spend over 2 hours on our phones, one way or another, every day?

Helpful pointers for our children:

1. Agree a clear set of rules and times with your child on screen time in the home. For example, dinner time, homework time and bedtime should be screen-free times.
2. Do as you say. Modelling behaviour is THE most powerful way you can influence your child's behaviour.
3. Restrict the use of computers/devices in the bedroom. Depending on the age of your child you may want to set a curfew or ban devices from the bedroom completely.
4. Try not to rely on screens too much to keep the kids amused. It can be easy to encourage kids to pick up the tablet or play a game on the computer to keep them occupied. This only confuses rules on screen time.
5. Chat to your child about what they do online and encourage them to use their screen time for learning and education.
6. Pick one evening a week where you do a family activity together, whether it's movie night, games night. Doing activities together as a family will help implement screen time guidelines and offer fun alternatives.
7. Finally, why not join in? Set some time aside to play your child's favourite computer game and discover the online world together.

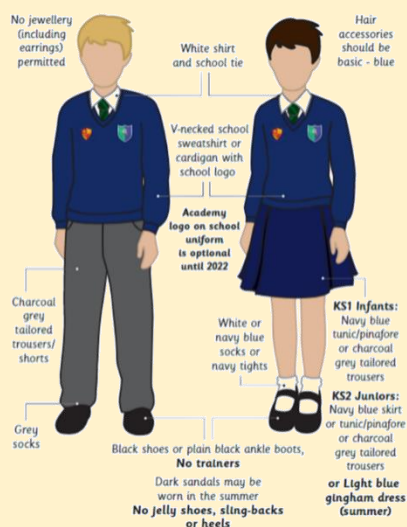
