

#### **Attendance Expectations**

BE AN ATTENDANCE

Children are expected to be in school **every day** unless they are unwell. All other reasons will be unauthorised. If your child is going to be absent, contact school and let us know before 9.20am. Children not in school may receive a phone call home or home visit. In line we our Attendance Policy, we are committed to supporting families in improving their child's attendance, before taking legal action.

### **Punctuality**

School starts at **8.50am**. Lessons start at **8.50am**.

School gates open at 8.40am.

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.



#### A SPOTLIGHT ON St Ann's School Uniform

The wearing of correct school uniform is **compulsory (all items).** This is incorporated in the Home School Agreement.

#### RATIONALE

The main benefits for the wearing of school uniform include:

- it helps pupils identify with the school and creates a sense of belonging (#TeamStAnns (3))
- it ensures all pupils feel equal and contributes to their self-esteem (pupils who do not wear correct school uniform can feel more or less special than everyone else)
- it disguises social and economic differences between pupils

#### WINTER/SUMMER UNIFORM

As the weather is so changeable nowadays in the UK, parents/carers can decide when they wish for their child to wear the winter or summer uniform

#### FOOTWEAR

When wearing the school uniform, children should wear black school shoes only, and not black trainers

#### HAIR

If hair is long enough to be tied up, it should be. This prevents head lice spreading. Hairstyles should be appropriate to wearing a school uniform. Hair accessories must be kept to a minimum and in school colours only (e.g. no big bows).

#### LOST PROPERTY

Any lost uniform may be found in **Lost Property.** Lost Property can be viewed at any time, but for convenience for parents/ carers is displayed in the front entrance every Friday afternoon.

#### LOGOS

No items of the school uniform are required to have the school and trust logos on (other than the school book bag which is provided free of charge when your child joins the school), although parents/ carers may wish to purchase items with the logos on.

#### BAGS

It is compulsory for children to bring the navy **school book bag** into school each day. **New starters** in the Early Years will be provided with a school bag funded by the Friends association. Pupils are permitted to bring one pump bag into school for any after schools they may attend. Holdalls and rucksacks are not permitted because they fall off the children's pegs and create a trip hazard. This forms part of our fire safety risk assessment.

#### PE KIT

Pupils must wear the full and correct **PE kit** to school on the days they have PE; this is instead of their school uniform. They should wear trainers rather than pumps.

The PE kit can also be worn on swimming or club days, unless otherwise advised by the school.

#### LABELLING

All children's clothing and footwear should be **labelled** with your child's name.

#### JEWELLERY (INC EARRINGS)


Children are not permitted to wear jewellery to school, this includes earrings. If children are getting their ears pierced, this should be done in the first week of the summer holidays to give them plenty of time to heal. Children may wear **backless plastic retainers.** Backless retainers mitigate health and safety issues.

#### **DENTAL EXAMINATIONS FOR RECEPTION & YEAR 1 CHILDREN**

The Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) and St Helens Local Authority are undertaking a dental survey of 5 year old children in schools across England. The survey provides information on the oral health of children and aims to support actions to improve oral health, reduce health inequalities and improve the provision of treatment services.

The dental survey is commissioned by St Helens local authority and involves a dental examination of selected reception and year 1 children. The survey will take place at St Ann's on Tuesday 7 November 2023.

Having a healthy mouth is important to overall health and wellbeing. Children who have tooth decay may have pain, infections, difficulties with eating, sleeping and socialising and may require time off school for dental treatment.

Oral health is therefore an important aspect of a child's overall health status and of their school readiness. Oral health is seen as a marker of wider health and social care issues including poor nutrition and obesity. Interventions that reduce sugar intake have the potential to impact tooth decay and obesity because high intakes of free-sugars are known risk factors for both.


