School gates open at 8.40am.



## A SPOTLIGHT ON CHRISTIAN VALUES



Over a two-year period we study 12 Christian Values. This means children encounter each value at least three times during their primary education, allowing for values to be revisited at a deeper level as the children grow older. The values are often a focus for Collective Worship. Class RE Reflection Areas reflect the value currently being studied. Children are rewarded with Dojos for living out our Christian values, some children have even been invited to Hot Chocolate with the Headteacher!

#### **ADMISSIONS ARRANGEMENTS**

St Helens Council has a duty under the <u>School Admissions Code</u> to consult on the admission arrangements of Community & Voluntary Controlled schools and the Co-ordinated Admission Scheme at least once every seven years, even if there have been no changes during that period.

The last full consultation on admission arrangements and co-ordinated schemes took place in December 2016, for the 2018/19 academic year. Last September St Helens Council contacted all schools, governing bodies and diocesan boards with capacity (SCAP) information, and to ask for any details of any changes to be made to admission arrangements prior to formal consultations taking place. Two primary schools are making changes for 2025/26.

#### **SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #13**

#### Helping your child to make friends

#### Work together to grow their friendship skills

Talk to your child about what makes a good friend, and practice friendship skills such as listening, sharing, compromising, and negotiating. Sit together and explore examples in everyday life and from TV and books. This will help your child think about what makes a good friend and feel less worried about friendship issues.

#### Help them to gain confidence

If your child is shy, this can make it feel more difficult to make and keep friends. Give your child lots of opportunities to connect and communicate with you in whatever ways you feel comfortable for them. Practising with you will give them more confidence to connect with others.

#### Model positive and healthy relationships

Happy relationships between parents and significant adults lead to better mental and physical health for all involved. Children thrive emotionally when they see and are involved in warm and caring relationships where they are respected and valued.

#### Reassure them that it's natural for friends to fall out sometimes

Children's friendships often change and can look different depending on your child's age and stage of development. While having friends at school is important, it is perfectly ordinary for your child to have difficulties with their friendships. Let your child know that being friends doesn't always mean agreeing or getting along with others all the time.

#### Talk the talk

Do you want to play catch?

Sometimes children can find it difficult to know how what they can say when talking with their peers. You can help your child by practicing what they can say to introduce themselves to someone new or to make a new friend. Help children to think of questions they can use to make connections with friends, such as: Would you like to play football or something else during break? Can I sit next to you in class?

#### SUPPORT WITH CHILDCARE COSTS

From 2nd January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31st March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

#### **URGENT WINTER WATER SAFETY MESSAGE**



RLSS UK offer safety advice for winter water safety, with simple steps to keep safe during the winter:

- 1. Never go onto the ice to play, to retrieve an object, or a pet
- 2. Never enter the ice to rescue somebody, call 999 and ask for the Fire and Rescue Service

#### What to do if you fall through the ice:

- Keep calm and shout for 'help'
- Spread your arms across the surface of the ice in front of you
- If the ice is strong enough, kick your legs to slide onto the ice
- Lie flat and pull yourself towards the bank
- If the ice breaks, work your way to the bank-breaking the ice in front of you anyway
- If you cannot climb out, wait for help and keep as still as possible. Press your arms by your side and keep your legs together. Keep your head clear of the water
- Once you are safe, go to hospital immediately for a check up

#### What to do if you see someone fall through the ice:

- Shout for assistance and phone the emergency services call 999 or 112
- Do not walk or climb onto the ice to attempt a rescue
- Shout to the casualty to 'keep still' and offer reassurance to keep them calm
- Try and reach them from the bank using a rope, pole, tree branch, clothing tied together or anything else which can extend your reach
- When reaching from the bank, lie down to avoid being pulled onto the ice
- If you cannot reach them, slide something which floats, such as a plastic bottle or football, across the ice for them to hold onto to stay afloat whilst help is on the way
- If the casualty is too far away, do not attempt to rescue them. Wait for the emergency services while calming and reassuring the casualty




