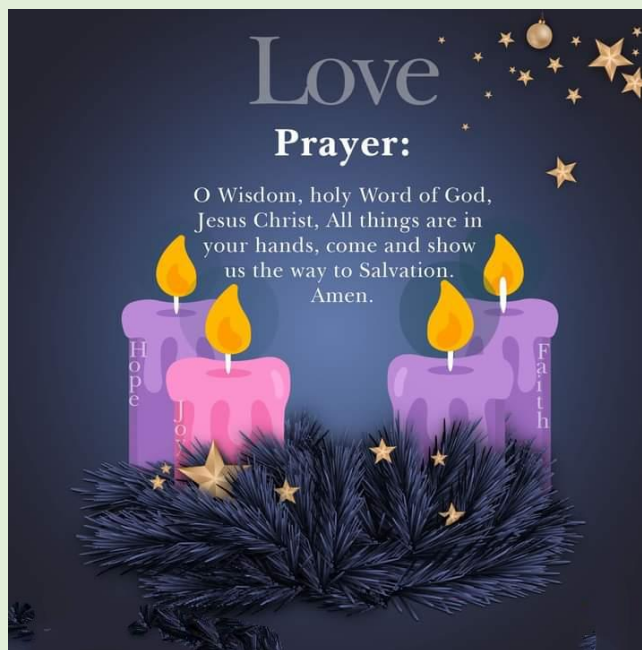

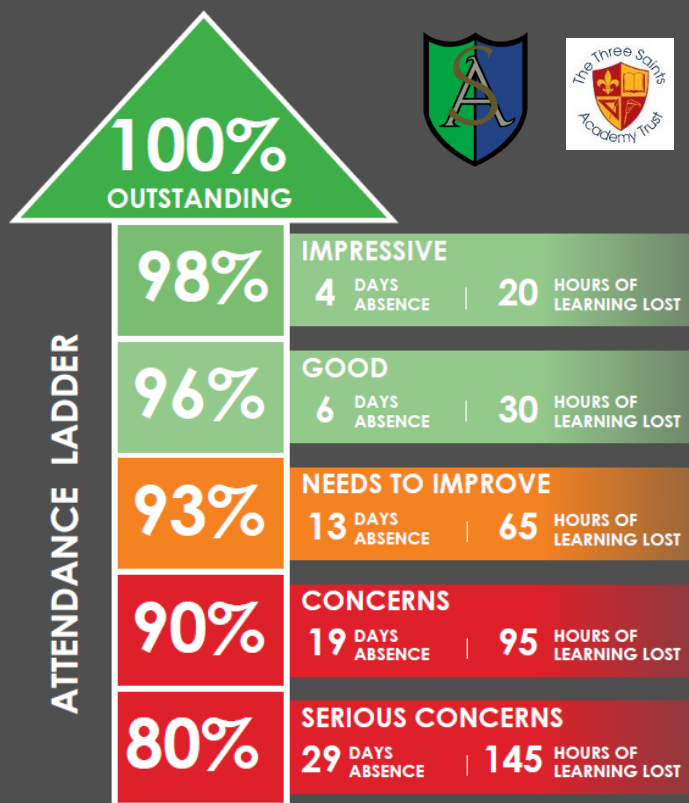
School starts at **8.50am**.

## A SPOTLIGHT ON: SPIRITUALITY



At St Ann's Church of England Primary School, spirituality is understood as our relationships with each other and God. It is an act of being fully human and discovering and revealing ourselves through love. Having a shared understanding amongst the community means individuals' spirituality can be nurtured. This understanding is explored and experienced during collective worship through our Anglican practices. Most typically this includes

through the Bible stories that are re-told (including through song), the stillness, prayers and the personal reflections shared. Providing the time and opportunity for children to relive their stories and reflect on why they are valuable to them, allows the children to express an emotional reaction to their personal experiences. The ability to live the emotion again, in the retelling of a significant moment, provides the means for children to move to the land of the spirit. And at the heart of the vast majority of their stories, is love. This is often revealed through four aspects; awareness of self, their relationship with others, a response to the beauty of the natural world and exploration of the beyond. Asking the questions 'What would Jesus do?' or 'Who would Jesus be?' demands children to consider the nature of our 'being' and the values and virtues we are living out. A moment of stillness makes space for just 'being,' for noticing and encourages everyone to be present to the self, to others, to the world and to the divine.

### **Spiritual development is an intrinsic part of the curriculum in the following ways:**

- Daily act of collective worship designed to nurture everyone's spiritual development through story, song, prayer, reflection, symbols, natural objects
- Regular Worship through Song led by Church choir director
- Half termly pupil led collective worship
- Weekly RE lessons which offer an opportunity for reflection
- Half termly church services
- KS2 Communion services
- Y5 & 6 Confirmation classes
- Spontaneous prayer or action in response to personal, local, national and global events e.g. sending cards to the library, get well messages to pupils who are in hospital
- Regular writing of prayers which are displayed as an outward expression of our love e.g. war, death of Queen Elizabeth II, Coronation of King Charles III
- Prayer spaces in every classroom and other central places
- Awe and wonder moments throughout the curriculum e.g. Literature shared during English lessons, PSHE lessons promoting mindfulness or use of debate, Natural Disasters Geography unit in Y6, growth in Science, study of visual arts in Art & Design



- Opportunity to visit external places that nurture pupils' cultural development through our Cultural Offer
- Focus Weeks, including Stand Up Speak Up week
- Shared experiences e.g. Jubilee family picnic, STAR day – charity fund raising day, Christingle & bunting making Workshops
- Outdoor learning e.g. in woodland
- Celebrations e.g. talent show, Worship through Praise, school production, birthday cards from school, texts/ emails of praise.

## A MESSAGE FROM MERSEYSIDE POLICE

After receiving complaints and recent incidents involving the public's safety due to parking outside of schools, officers will be monitoring schools during drop off and pick up times. Vehicles have been parking with little consideration for the safety and welfare of residents and students travelling to and from school.

We ask parents/ carers dropping off and picking up children be mindful of the dangers of parking recklessly. Since this type of behaviour is an offence, officers will be issuing tickets to drives found to be, but not limited to:

- Parking on zigzag lines
- Causing obstructions to the pavements
- Causing an obstruction to the roads
- Driving in a reckless manner

The purpose of this is for the community's safety as children are travelling to and from school and for the residents in the area.

## SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #15

### Why it's good to talk

We've all been on the receiving end of a difficult conversation. But that doesn't make it any easier when you have to have one with your child.

It's important every child has someone they trust to look to for help.

We all want children to grow up in a safe and loving environment and to become happy, confident adults. To get there there'll be times they need to talk to someone, for advice or for support. There will also be times when you need to explain something that might upset them. As their parent or carer, it's up to you to talk to them when you think they might need a nudge in the right direction, or to share news or information that's going to affect their lives.

### Before starting a difficult chat

Whatever it is you want to discuss, it's important to think about where and how to talk so children will listen.

There's no telling how long the conversation is going to last, so the first thing to consider is where and when you're going to start it. For e.g., if you start in the evening when they're tired, your child or children might not be able to concentrate.

If you're talking to just one child about something, consider how private the time and place are. It might work best to have it at a time when brothers and sisters aren't around to interrupt.

It could be good to have it in a relaxed and neutral place, like on a walk or in the car.

Have materials available that can help with a discussion for e.g. a book or some paper and pens.

### REMEMBER

Give them as long as they need to answer without interrupting.

Let your child ask you questions too.

Let them know that they can trust you to keep their confidence and that you want them to always feel they can talk to you, other people they trust or organisations like [Childline](#), when anything is worrying them.

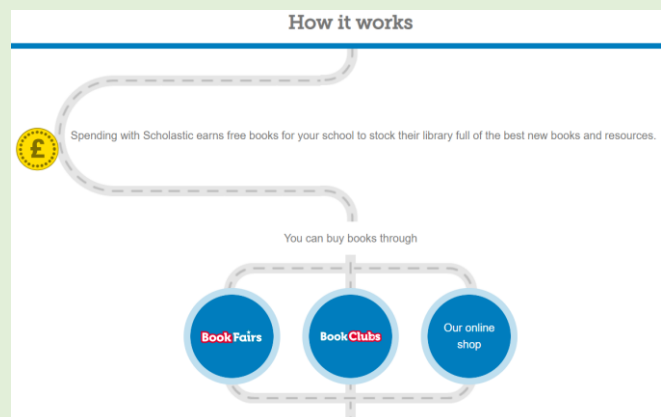
## MERSEY FOREST UPDATE

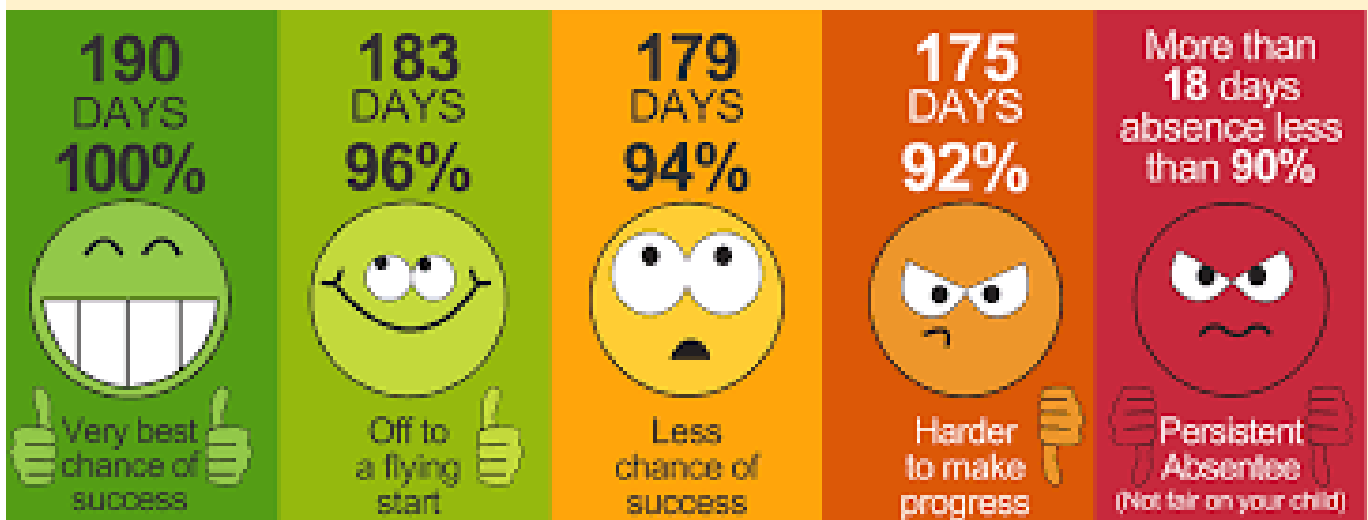

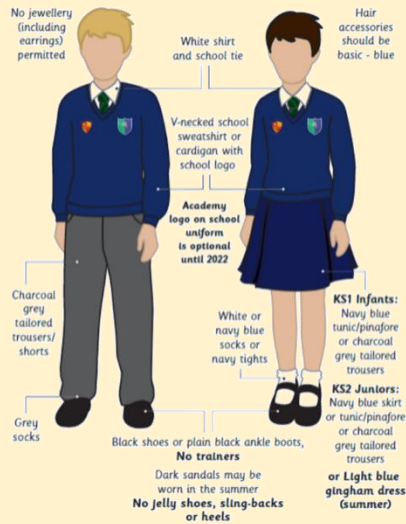
