## Punctuality

School starts at 8.50am.
Lessons start at 8.50am.
School gates open at 8.40am.
Children arriving after 8.50 am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

## We have three home-school learning apps designed to support children with learning at home. Login details for these apps can be found in each child's reading diary.

## NumBots

NumBots equips each pupil with the set of core maths skills they require by building their knowledge from the ground up - starting at the very beginning with subitising. NumBots has several settings and games for your child to play, all aimed at developing pupils' ability to use efficient mental calculation strategies to add and subtract two-digit numbers. This knowledge is vital to ensure children can access many
 different areas of the mathematics curriculum fluently and confidently. When using NumBots, we recommend a 'little and often' approach; 3 minutes practice a day, 5 times a week, will make a real difference to your child's number and calculation knowledge.

## Times Tables Rock Stars

Times Tables Rock Stars is a maths programme that has a proven track record of boosting children's fluency and recall in multiplication and division. Suitable for all KS2 learners, the question-based games automatically adapt
 to each child's unique learning needs, helping them to recall their times tables in record speed. Accessible on any device, via the app or browser, children can play anytime, anywhere. Times Table Rock Stars has several settings and games for your child to play, all aimed at developing their times-table knowledge. This knowledge is vital to ensure children can access many different areas of the mathematics curriculum fluently and confidently. Whilst playing, children can earn virtual coins to personalise their rock avatars and move up the rock leaderboard from 'New Artist' to 'Rock Hero'! Just like NumBots, we recommend a 'little and often' approach when using TTRS; 3 minutes practice a day, 5 times a week, will make a real difference to your child's times table knowledge.

## Bug Club

Bug Club is an online reading programme children can use to access a wide range of ebooks at home. The online 'Bug Club' books are carefully aligned to the book banded system used in school and match children to books that cater to their reading level. Children can use the Bug Club website to access ebooks alongside the reading books they bring home. The 'Bug 'Club' ebook collection includes a wide range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry books that include well known characters. The ebooks can be accessed on a range of devices using your child's login details. Quizzes, which help children to practise their reading skills, are also available for children to complete at the end of each book. Children can use the books on Bug Club to develop


Bug Club their reading and comprehension skills, in the same way as the books sent home from school. Please indicate in their reading diary when children have read a 'Bug Club' book and completed a reading quiz.

## Attendance: the top facts to know \& share

The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40\% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with $84 \%$ of pupils who were regular attenders.
- And $\mathbf{3 6 \%}$ of PA children in KS4 got 9 to $\mathbf{4}$ in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with $84 \%$ of regular attenders. ${ }^{1}$

And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

- More than half (54\%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to $36 \%$ of pupils who were persistently absent in both years. ${ }^{2}$
But attendance is important for more than just attainment:
- Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing. ${ }^{3}$



## HARDSHIP FUND

Following a discussion at Parent Forum last year, and requests from parents who wish to help families in need, it was agreed that school would establish a Hardship Fund.

The Hardship Fund is a discretionary fund available to provide some relief from immediate financial hardship for the families of St Ann's. It will seek to ease the financial hardship of those
who have no recourse to other sources of financial assistance.

If parents/ carers would like to make a donation into the hardship, you can do this via the school office.

- Write down 3 things you like about yourself and read it every morning.
- Share your thoughts with your friends and ask them what they like.
- Focus on hobbies you enjoy or things you are good at - this can help build your confidence.

## NUMBOTS \& TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYsY2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same

The table below shows the number of children who have accessed the programmes in the last 7 days. You can show that your child has accessed either of the programmes by simply ticking the logo off in their home school diary. Let's do this!
