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



A SPOTLIGHT ON: READING FOR PLEASURE

Overview:

Welcome to Reading at St Ann's, where we are dedicated to fostering a love for reading and empowering our students with essential literacy skills. Our Reading curriculum is designed to engage students through a mix of whole-class, small group, and individual teaching sessions using age-appropriate fiction and non-fiction texts. Starting from Reception, we prioritise key skills such as blending, segmenting, decoding, and sight recognition to enhance word-reading fluency. The integration of comprehension skills with fluency ensures that students not only read with confidence but also understand and enjoy the content. We believe in developing both



fluency and comprehension concurrently to create confident readers who find joy in learning through reading. Throughout their journey at St Ann's, students explore a variety of authors and poets, allowing them to develop personal preferences and a deep appreciation for books. Diverse texts are incorporated each year, providing a rich literary experience and exposure to new vocabulary and text structures.

Phonics:

Our phonics programme plays a vital role in early reading skill acquisition and comprehension abilities. We use the well-regarded Read Write Inc. phonics scheme, which teaches English sounds, corresponding letters, and letter formation for writing. This approach, coupled with reading books aligned with the sounds learned, ensures that children gain confidence and success in their reading endeavours.

After Read, Write, Inc.:

Upon completing the Read Write Inc. scheme, children at St Ann's further refine their comprehension skills using book-banded books. We regularly assess reading levels using the PM Benchmark, focusing on various aspects such as instructional reading level, ability to read for meaning, and integration of meaning with structural and visual cues.

Whole Class Reading:

Our whole-class reading lessons are a daily highlight, where teachers read

challenging texts, fostering in-depth discussions and questioning. These activities aim to enhance vocabulary and comprehension skills, with teachers selecting high-quality literature linked to relevant topics.

Bedtime Stories:

Bedtime stories hold a special place in our approach, recognising their significance in a child's growth. These stories not only build a love for reading but also provide a unique bonding time and a calming routine before sleep. We encourage every child to have access to a book read by a parent or carer to cultivate this wonderful habit.

Reading Rewards:

To promote and celebrate the habit of daily reading, we have a rewarding scheme that our students cherish. With Bronze, Silver, and Gold awards, children are encouraged to read regularly, fostering a strong reading culture in our school. We monitor home/school diaries daily to ensure consistent reading habits.

What books should I receive?

- Read, Write, Inc. Books (if your child accesses the scheme)
- Book banded book based on PM Benchmarking (if you child has not yet reached the free reader band)
- A bedtime story book (chosen by your child from our class/school library)

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #18

DO YOU SOMETIMES WORRY ABOUT HOW YOU ARE FEELING?

Here are some brilliant tips from children just like you". These children have also had ups and downs with their mental health and want to pass on some ideas that have helped them:

- Ask for help from a teacher, parent, brother, sister, or other family member. Keep telling until someone listens to you.
- Remember you are not alone everyone goes through tough times.

Be kind to yourself - everyone is perfect in their own way.

- Stay calm take some breaths or find somewhere to sit quietly for 2 minutes.
- Go outside and get some exercise to make yourself feel stronger.
- spend time with your family and friends (or pets).
- It's okay to not always be okay.
- Think of your favourite thing and write it down.
- Keep a diary to track all your emotions.
- Stay positive and focus on things that make you happy. If you can't think of anything, maybe a friend can help you.
- Remember you are enough, and you are the only you.
- If you are being bullied, maybe the bully is being bullied or has something going on at home and they're taking it out on someone else. Tell an adult or trusted friend.

UPDATE INFORMATION FROM ST HELENS COUNCIL ON CONTAINMENT OF MEASLES

NHS England are now running a catch up campaign for all children who have not been fully vaccinated against measles, mumps and rubella (MMR).

All children up to the age of 11 years old who have not been fully vaccinated will be invited for a vaccination against MMR,

For children up to 5 years parents will receive a text message or letter from their GP; for children from 6 -11 year old NHS England will contact parents direct via text or letter.

There are now 50 children in the West Midlands who have been hospitalised with measles and NHS England are aiming to limit the spread of measles across the country.

Thank you again for supporting this vital campaign and helping protect children against these highly infectious diseases.

NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. 
