A SPOTLIGHT ON: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT



What is Personal Development?

A school's curriculum extends beyond the academic. Schools support pupils to develop in many diverse aspects of life. They are crucial in preparing pupils for their adult lives, teaching them to understand how to engage with society and providing them with plentiful opportunities to do so.

How does St Ann's support children's personal development?

At St Ann's, provision to nurture pupils' personal development is plentiful, high quality and extends beyond the academic.

It begins with the Lunar Curriculum which promotes six 'Personal Learning and Thinking Skills'.

Independent enquirers
Creative thinkers
Reflective learners
Team workers
Self-managers
Effective communicators

The Lunar Curriculum is also enhanced to nurture children's personal development e.g.

- Focus days/ weeks e.g. Anti-Bullying Day, Safer Internet Day, Stand Up Speak Up Week, Aspirations Days,
 British Science Week, World Book Day, Healthy Living Week
- Visits and visitors e.g. Bikability, Crucial Crew, visitors from other faiths
- Curriculum and Cultural Offer which involves children taking part in 14 curriculum/ cultural experiences during their primary career e.g. museums, art galleries, West End show
- Opportunity to go on 3 residentials in KS2
- Blue Sky Experiences 50 experiences children are guaranteed to have at St Ann's
- Sporting and dramatic performances which develop children's talents and interests e.g. Talent Show, Y6
 Production, numerous sporting competitions
- Extra-curricular provision

Children's personal development, **talents and interests** are also nurtured through our extensive **wider curriculum offer**. Typically, in any given week there will be at least 12 clubs available for pupils to access, a minimum of 50% of which are sports based, as per our commitment to promoting positive physical health and well-being. Pupils and parents say that our extra-curricular provision is engaging and meets the interests of our children. Identified pupils are often sign-posted to clubs to support and enhance their academic, personal or social development. Clubs are available for every group.

Pupils personal develop is also nurtured through the following:

- Our spiritual, moral, social and cultural education
- Our pastoral support
- Our provision that promotes physical and mental health
- Our PSHE & RSHE curriculums
- Developing children's knowledge and understanding of fundamental British Values, equality and diversity and protected characteristics
- Providing opportunities to debate



SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #19

How to talk about grief

Children feel similar emotions to adults when they experience a loss, but they may not be able to express it in the same way.

Children may sometimes appear to accept the death, and later become distressed and upset. It is important they are given the time, space and support they need to manage this.

Barnardos Child Bereavement Service recommends that the cause of death (in simple terms) should be shared with children, so they are not at risk of blaming themselves. Being made aware that everyone eventually dies, but normally not until they are very old, can help address the worry that everyone else around them may also die soon. The words "death" or "dead" should be used, rather than phrases like "gone to sleep", "lost" or "gone". The honest and direct language reduces confusion, and gives the child or young person all the information that you have. It may feel uncomfortable, or like you're giving them more to worry about, but in reality, you're taking away all the things they could invent on their own when you tell them the truth.

NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYs-Y2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same




