

# **Punctuality**

School starts at **8.50am**. Lessons start at **8.50am**.

School gates open at 8.40am.

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

# A SPOTLIGHT ON: PARENT FORUM



At St Ann's we have a Parent Forum. The purpose of the Parent Forum is to provide another channel of communication between home and school.

The group meet to celebrate the work of our school and to offer a parental perspective on agenda items. Minutes of the meeting are posted on the school website. At the end of the academic year an impact report is produced. This is also uploaded onto our website. The forum meets once a term and they are supported by the school's senior leadership team. *Individual matters are not addressed at Parent Forum as this is a public forum that only meets once a term.* 

Parents nominate themselves to be their child's Class Rep. If more than one parent/ carer applies to be the representative for a particular class, a parent/ carer who has previously not held the role will be randomly selected (names drawn from a hat). Parents/ carers who have previously held the position can be able to be a representative again as long as there is no other interest.




# CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY PASSPORT BANK

There is no cost to parents or carers, and each course consists of 5 workshops covering.

- Psychoeducation and empathy
- Cycle of change and motivational language
- Reflecting on caring responses.
- What to try when things feel stuck
- Coaching your loved one to make their own changes.
- Relapse contingency planning.

# **HEALTHY CHILD PROGRAMME**

As part of The Healthy Child Programme in St Helens, which includes health visiting and school nurses, there is also an 'Enhancing Families' team (formerly Family Nurse Partnership). The Enhancing Families Team have reviewed their offer and eligibility criteria for referral into the service. The team includes three specialist nurses who will support families requiring additional support in the antenatal period and up until the child is 2 years old.

# Eligibility criteria:

In pregnancy:

First time mums-to-be, or pregnant women with other children under school age who meet **any** of the following criteria:

- Teenage parent 18 and under.
- Mums-to-be with additional educational/social communication needs (including ASD)
- Young people Looked After or who are Care Leavers.
- Mums who have lost a child/ had child removed.
- Parental drug and/or alcohol misuse
- Domestic Abuse (either known police reports or self-reported)
- Family having a pre-birth assessment or involved in CP and pre-proceedings
- Refugees

# **NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS**

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYs-Y2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same




