#### **Punctuality**

School starts at **8.50am**. Lessons start at **8.50am**.

School gates open at 8.40am.

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

#### **BREAKFAST & AFTER SCHOOL CLUB**

Base provides high quality childcare at the beginning and end of the school day from 8.00-8.50am and from 3.15—6.00pm, for children aged 4-11 years. It is a safe and secure environment where children are cared for by qualified staff that have experience in providing play activities for young children. A wide range of activities, which are both physically and mentally stimulating, are available. Activities meet the needs of all our children. Activities are rotated and include; crafts, sports, table top activities, outdoor play, toys and games.

#### **FOOD AND DRINK**

Drinks and snacks are provided in line with the school's healthy food and drink policy. Breakfast usually includes cereals, toast, crumpets, water, milk and a selection of fruit. Evening snack might include; yoghurts, cheese and crackers, vegetable dippers and humous, sandwiches, pizza, fruit and much more.

#### **BOOKING A PLACE**

If you are interested in a place for your child, please email your requirements to <a href="mailto:stannsce@three-saints.org.uk">stannsce@three-saints.org.uk</a> in the first instance. One month's paid notice is required to cancel a booking or you will still be charged. All absences must be paid for. The waiting list and fee book are confidential. Please speak to staff regarding queries.

#### **ATTENDING BASE**

When children first join Breakfast or After School Club they will be allowed to settle in at their own pace. We encourage parents or carers to visit After School Club with their children shortly before they are due to start. This gives the children the opportunity to look around the club and ask any questions. It also gives parents the opportunity to complete the necessary paperwork for registration with the club if this has not yet been done,

#### **PAYMENTS**

When registering you will be asked to fill in a fee agreement form. Fees must be paid in advance. Failure to pay these fees will result in your child losing their place. Fees can be paid using Arbor, childcare vouchers or Government choices scheme. If you are having difficulties making payments please speak to staff in confidence for support.

#### **COLLECTION**

Children must be collected at or before 6.00pm otherwise you will be subject to further charges. Late collection fees will be charged at £5.00 per 15 minutes.

#### Worrying about the holidays

The holidays are different for everyone. You might be excited about a holiday or having time off, or you could be thinking about what might happen or how you'll cope.

You might be worried about:

- feeling lonely or not going out
- not seeing people who normally support you
- problems at home or having to <u>care for your family</u>
- coping without a routine
- being hurt or abused.

#### **NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS**

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYs-Y2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same


