#### A SPOTLIGHT ON: MATHS




Our Maths provision at St Ann's aims to build a curriculum which coherently develops and deepens learning; resulting in all pupils knowing more, remembering more and understanding more.

When teaching Maths, we use a variety of teaching methods and resources that allow all pupils to experience Maths success, regardless of prior starting points and previous knowledge. Over time, children will become more resilient learners who are able to understand that to make mistakes, or become stuck, is a necessary step in any learning. All children will be appropriately challenged and supported in their Maths lessons through varied fluency, reasoning and problem solving – The 3 Aims of the Maths National Curriculum.

Irrespective of personal starting points, children will explore Maths in depth, and use a range of Mathematical vocabulary to reason and explain their own thinking. We strongly encourage the use of correct, subject specific terminology and children using this key vocabulary in full sentences to articulate what they are doing, and most importantly, **why** they are doing it. We do not want children to simply be able to recall procedures by rote, as this suggests limited understanding of why they are doing what they are doing.

Visual representations, concrete manipulatives and pictorial images are used in all Maths lessons to support children's developing Mathematical understanding in a variety of ways. These include, but are not limited to, numicon, base 10, place value counters, bead strings, number lines, digit cards and hundred squares. This is inline with the CPA approach to learning – Concrete Manipulatives, Pictorial Images and Abstract Concepts. Embedded throughout Maths lessons are the 5 Principles of Teaching for Mastery.



We encourage all children from EYFS through to Y6 to regularly access and use Numbots and TTRS. These platforms aim to reinforce and consolidate learning as well as increase fluency, speed and accuracy, ultimately improving children's confidence with basic skills. In addition to daily Maths lessons, EYFS use the NCETM Numberblocks program which introduces the concept of number to young children gently through engaging storylines and characters.

Children take part in daily Maths lessons and aside from the daily Maths lesson, a number of additional programmes are used at St Ann's to support children's learning. These include; Mastering Number (a nationwide programme accredited by the NCETM) in EYFS, Y1, Y2, Y4 + Y5; Maths Meetings in Y3 + Y6 and discrete micro teaching of Times Tables in Y3 + Y4.

#### **SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #23**



#### Neglect

Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a child's basic needs and is <u>the most common form of child</u> <u>abuse</u>.

A child may be left hungry or dirty, without adequate clothing, shelter, supervision, medical or health care.

A child may be put in danger or not protected from physical or emotional harm.

They may not get the love, care and attention they need from their parents.

A child who's neglected will often suffer from other <u>abuse</u> as well. Neglect is dangerous and can cause serious, long-term damage - even death.

NSPCC reported in December 2023,

106% increase in child cruelty and neglect offences in England in the past 5 years Data shows that offences of adults neglecting, mistreating or assaulting children have doubled over the last 5 years. Child protection systems face significant pressures and the NSPCC are reaching out to the government for a system that responds effectively to reports of cruelty and neglect. Child protection rates have increased following the pandemic.

#### **NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS**

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYs-Y2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same




