Y6 SATs WEEK

This year, Y6 SATs week will commence on Monday 13 May. The timetable below shows the statutory tests that all children will undertake. It is essential that your child is well rested before this week so that they have the greatest chance of achieving their potential. During the week please itself, ensure your child goes to bed at an age appropriate time and is off devices at least 1 hour before bedtime. Children must be in school each day and on time as the tests start first thing each day. Please make sure your child eats breakfast before leaving the house. Should you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's class teacher.

Parents will be given their child's scaled score and whether they have reached the expected standard set by the Department for Education ('NS' means that the expected standard was not achieved and 'AS' means the expected standard was achieved). The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test is:

- 80 (the lowest scaled score that can be awarded)
- 120 (the highest scaled score)

The expected standard for each test is a scaled score of 100 or more. If a child is awarded a scaled score of 99 or less they won't have achieved the expected standard in the test. The Department for Education expects at least 65 per cent of children to reach the expected standard.

Y2 SATS

This year Y2 SATs have become non-statutory for the first time. As a result of this, our Y2 cohort will complete them during our whole school assessment week in June, as opposed to the during the month of May, when they historically were untaken. Schools are free to manage the timetable and administration so that they are completed in a low-stress, low-key, age appropriate way; some children won't even be aware they've taken them!

Children will complete the following tests:

KS1 reading

The reading test for Y2 is made up of two separate papers: Paper 1 is a selection of texts totalling 400 to 700 words, with questions interspersed. Paper 2 is a reading booklet with a selection of passages totalling 800 to 1100 words. Children write their answers in a separate booklet. Each paper should take around 30 minutes, but children are not strictly timed, as the tests are not intended to assess children's ability to work at speed. The texts in the reading papers cover a range of fiction, nonfiction and poetry, and get progressively more difficult towards the end of the test. Teachers have the option to stop the test at any point that they feel is appropriate for a particular child.

KS1 maths

The Y2 maths test is made up of two papers: Paper 1 (arithmetic, worth 25 marks and taking around 15 minutes) and Paper 2 (problem-solving and reasoning, worth 35 marks and taking 35 minutes, with a break if necessary). Question types include multiple choice.

In order for children to achieve their potential it is important that children are having an age appropriate amount of sleep and are off devices at least 1 hour before bedtime. Please also ensure that your child eats breakfast before school each day.

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #25

Keeping your child safe in sport

Sport and exercise are great ways for children and young people to learn new skills, keep fit and make friends.

Whether it's a martial arts club, football, dancing or swimming sports can be an important part of growing up and learning to be more independent. Wherever children and young people are, it's important they're safe and happy.

What to look for in a sports club, group or activity?

It's important to look for a sports club, group or activity that takes the safety and wellbeing of your child seriously. Always check if the club or organisation is accredited or affiliated to a body (e.g. a sports governing body), as this should mean they have the right safeguarding policies and procedures in place. Even if they're accredited, we detail some key things to look for below to ensure they take children's and young people's safety seriously.

- A safe environment(Tab content hidden)
 - A welfare or child protection officer
- Effective consent and emergency processes
 - Procedures and processes
 - Safe recruitment processes

- Safeguarding training
- Suitable supervision
- Written standards of good practice

Remember, it's never wrong to ask for more information when it comes to children's and young people's safety, wellbeing and safeguarding.

NUMBOTS & TIMESTABLE ROCKSTARS

Daily use of Numbots and TTRockstars has been proved to boost number and times table recall speed significantly, impacting positively on children's Mathematical Development. Just as the expectation at St Ann's is to read for 5 out of every 7 days each week, the expectation to access either Numbots (EYs-Y2) or TTRockstars (Y2-Y6) is the same


ATTENDANCE REWARD RAFFLE


