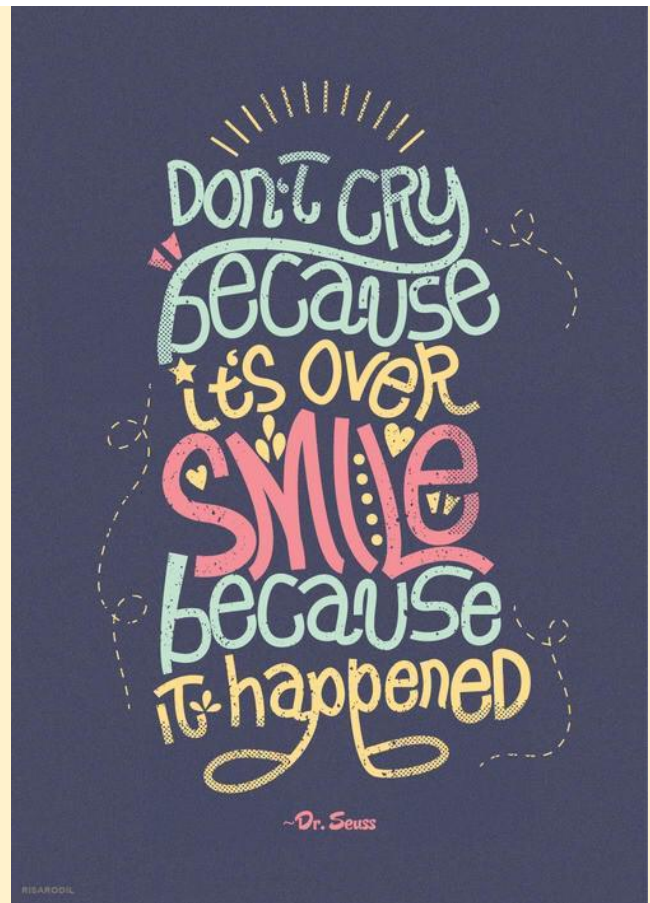

Children arriving after 8.50am will need to use the main entrance. Children who enter school via the main entrance will be registered as late. Regularly missing the beginning of lessons has a negative impact on a child's progress and wellbeing.

A SPOTLIGHT ON: Religious Education



At St Ann's we believe that high quality Religious Education (RE) is the key to enabling every child to flourish.

RE prepares children for citizenship in today's diverse society. It enables them to develop sensitivity to, and respect for others. Through authentic encounters, children will develop diversity dexterity and be equipped with the ability to hold an informed conversation about religious beliefs and practices.

Quality RE has the potential, more than any other subject, to have the most powerful and lasting effect on the child's heart and mind. It is a subject that combines academic rigour with the development of the character and spirit of the child. RE provides opportunities for spiritual development and personal reflection. On a quest to discover more about religion and world views children will discover more about themselves. As RE develops children's knowledge and understanding of the nature of religion and belief, it provokes challenging questions about meaning and purpose, truth and values, identity and belonging. Children will experience, explore and encounter a wide range of creative and challenging multi-sensory activities that will help them to discover the answers to fundamental questions such as these: –

- Who am I and what does it mean to be me?
- In what ways do/can I relate to others?
- How/where can I encounter God?
- How can I make a positive contribution to the world in which I live?
- What values, attitudes, beliefs and behaviour are important to me?
- What does it mean to have faith?



Questful R.E.

Our R.E syllabus is taught through the Blackburn Diocesan Board of Education programme 'Questful R.E.'

Through an open investigative enquiry approach the children are given the sense of being on a quest of discovery. A key feature of the syllabus is the large number of questions included in each unit. The purpose of these questions is to give children opportunity to investigate, reflect, evaluate and make meaning. In doing so they will discover more about themselves, their relationships with others, their relationship with the world around them and their relationship with God.



Collective Worship

Collective worship is the unique heartbeat of our school and is a wider opportunity for children and adults to encounter faith by engaging in conversations about God, both as individuals and together. Collective Worship takes place daily and in a variety of ways these include Worship through Song and Worship with a member of St Ann's Church.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE



The 2024 Challenge starts on **22 June** online and in Scotland, and on **6 July** in England and Wales.

The Summer Reading Challenge is a FREE holiday activity for children. It's all about reading for fun, aiming to improve children's reading skills and confidence. The Challenge runs every year throughout the summer holidays, and all children aged 4-11 are welcome to take part.

Children can read anything they like (really - anything!) and collect free rewards for their reading.

This year's Challenge theme, **Marvellous Makers**, is all about creativity. From dance to drawing, junk modelling to music, there's something for everyone! Children will be able to find new reads linked to their favourite creative arts, and access free activities at the library.

Children can take part for FREE, either at the library OR online:

- You can sign up **at your local library** and take part in person. A librarian will give you a special collector folder and help you find books to read. You'll collect special stickers and rewards for your reading.
OR
- You can take part **online** by signing up **here**, on the official Challenge website. You'll set up a profile with a reading goal and log your books. When you reach your goal, you will unlock a virtual badge and certificate.

Please note, the in-person and online Challenges are separate. Physical incentives like medals are only available via the library, for those taking part in the in-person Challenge.

The Summer Reading Challenge is developed by **The Reading Agency**, delivered in partnership with public libraries, and funded by Arts Council England. Each year, the Challenge motivates around 700,000 children to keep reading over the summer holidays.

YEAR 6 LEAVERS' SERVICE & SHIRT SIGNING

ADVANCE NOTICE

In the Autumn, St Ann's Church and St Ann's Millennium Centre will be introducing Horizon, a parking eye camera system in the church and centre car park. This will not affect pick up and drop offs for the school run (up to a maximum of 19 minutes 59 seconds) but will prevent long-term unauthorised parking.

Paying groups at the centre and visitors to church have not been able to use the car park. We regret that we have had to take this step, but due to the level of unauthorised parking and abuse to volunteers we have been forced to introduce this measure.

There will be prominent notices around the car park when this is installed.

SCHOOL POLICY REMINDERS

Before we head into a brand new school year, we would like to draw our parents' attention to some of our policies that we would like support with. By ensuring you and your child follow our school policies, it means our school is a happy and safe place for everyone, and our staff can spend time focused on the children's education, rather than getting distracted by other matters.

BRANDED CLOTHING

Branded clothing is not permitted. All uniform items, including PE kit, must be plain navy.

EAR PIERCING POLICY

Please remember children are not permitted to wear earrings to school. If your child is having their ears pierced shortly, this must be done within the **first couple of days of the summer holidays** so that the earrings can be removed on our return to school in September. Thank you for your support with this health & safety matter.

MAKE UP

The wearing of make up, including nail varnish and false nails, is not permitted. Children arriving at school in make up will be asked to wash it off.

SNACKS

The only snacks permitted at playtime are:

- Toast
- Fruit
- Vegetables

Children who continue to bring other food items in to school will be asked to have these snacks for lunch or put in their bag to take home. Children will be offered an alternative snack of fruit or vegetables.

SCHOOL BAGS

Please ensure your children bring their school book bag to school each day. This should not be a rucksack, as we do not have the space in our cloakroom. Rucksacks tend to fall off the children's pegs and cause a trip hazard for our pupils and staff.

Dear Parent/Caregiver

We are writing to you today to make you aware of the new Pharmacy First service and how it may relate to you and your child/children. Several of the conditions which are now able to be treated in Pharmacies are predominantly seen in childhood including impetigo, ear infections, infected insect bites and acute sore throat. For these common conditions you no longer need to make a GP appointment to get NHS treatment. Simply attend the pharmacy and they can now provide Prescription only treatment. We have included a short summary of the conditions below.

- Impetigo**- Golden/yellow lesions, most commonly on the exposed skin on the face. Patients usually are not otherwise unwell but the lesions can be mildly itchy. Treated with antibiotic creams or oral antibiotics.
- Ear Infections**- Earache and sometimes discharge visible in the ear canal. Treated with Antibacterial Ear drops or oral antibiotics.
- Acute Sore Throat**- Sore, swollen tonsils not caused by a recent cough or cold. Treated with oral antibiotics.
- Infected Insect Bites**- Pain, heat and redness occurring at the site on an insect bite, which may spread, typically in the first 3 days. May also present with pus at the site. Treated with oral antibiotics.

SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #32

Why it's good to talk

We've all been on the receiving end of a difficult conversation. But that doesn't make it any easier when you have to have one with your child.

It's important every child has someone they trust to look to for help.

We all want children to grow up in a safe and loving environment and to become happy, confident adults. To get there there'll be times they need to talk to someone, for advice or for support. There will also be times when you need to explain something that might upset them.

As their parent or carer, it's up to you to talk to them when you think they might need a nudge in the right direction, or to share news or information that's going to affect their lives.

Before starting a difficult chat

Whatever it is you want to discuss, it's important to think about where and how to talk so children will listen.

There's no telling how long the conversation is going to last, so the first thing to consider is where and when you're going to start it. For e.g., if you start in the evening when they're tired, your child or children might not be able to concentrate.

If you're talking to just one child about something, consider how private the time and place are. It might work best to have it at a time when brothers and sisters aren't around to interrupt.

It could be good to have it in a relaxed and neutral place, like on a walk or in the car.

Have materials available that can help with a discussion for e.g. a book or some paper and pens.

REMEMBER

Give them as long as they need to answer without interrupting.

Let your child ask you questions too.

Let them know that they can trust you to keep their confidence and that you want them to always feel they can talk to you, other people they trust or organisations like [Childline](#), when anything is worrying them.

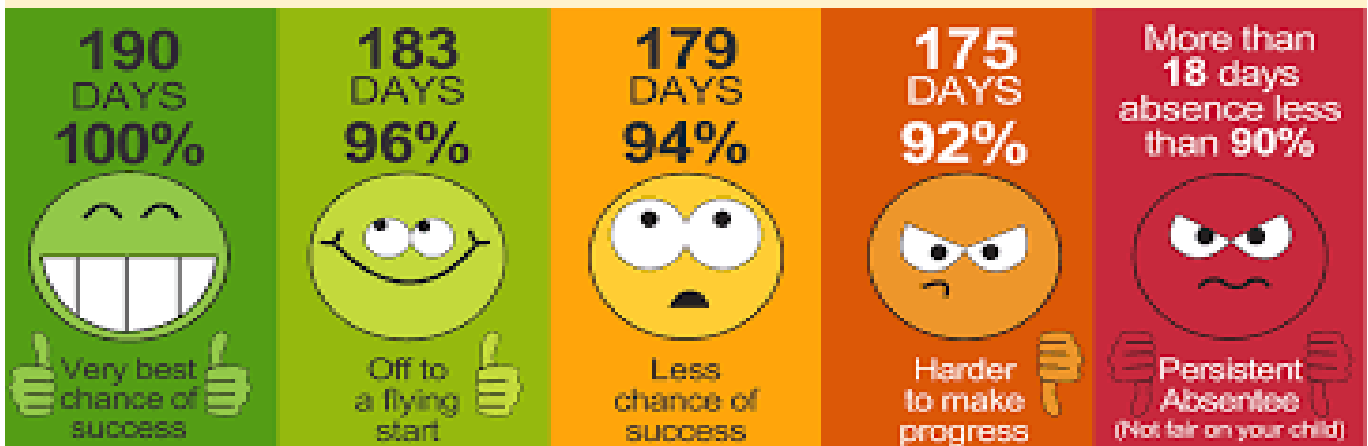

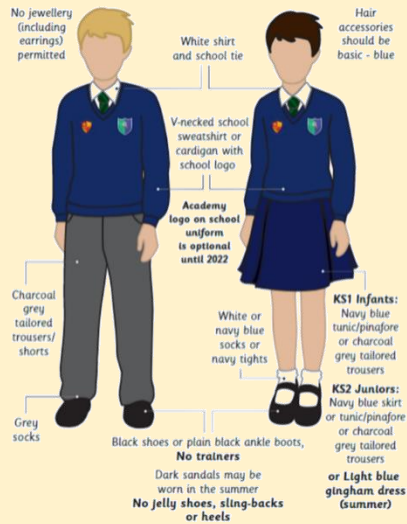

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice

Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines

5 consecutive days of term time leave Penalty Notice

Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave. 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
