Books range in price from £2 to £15.

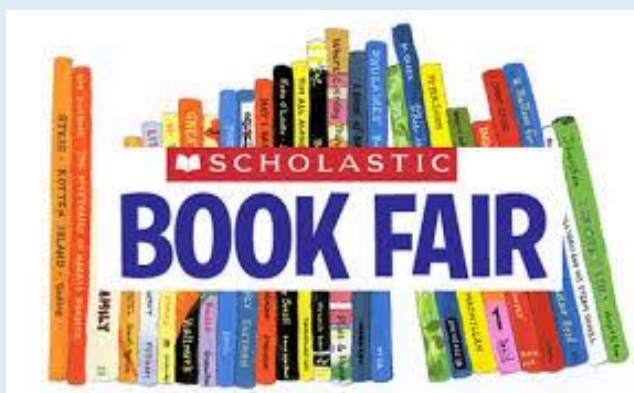

On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November, the remaining books will be on sale in the school hall from 3.20 until 3.45 pm for parent and carers to view with their children.

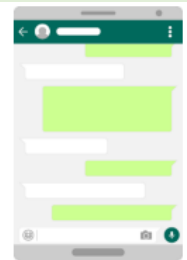
In previous years, your generous purchases have not only provided children with new reading experiences at home but have generated significant funds for school to purchase additional books for our class libraries.

### WhatsApp

**Users should be at least 13 years old to use WhatsApp.** We frequently receive reports of children not using WhatsApp appropriately, such as sharing images to embarrass others, sending hurtful messages, spreading rumours, or excluding people from group chats to make them feel left out.



Since WhatsApp lacks parental controls, it is important to think about whether it is really the right platform for your child. For example, you should consider if your child has the critical thinking skills to recognise bullying. Furthermore, do they understand how to manage peer pressure and refrain from joining in on harmful behaviour?

If your child is using WhatsApp, it is crucial to have regular conversations with them. Talk about who they are chatting with, encourage them to think carefully about the messages they send and how they might be perceived by others. Finally, make sure to model good digital behaviour yourself, as children often learn by observing the adults around them.

#### What should I be aware of if my child is using WhatsApp?

- **Group chats:** Everyone within a group, even if they are not one of your child's contacts, will be able to see all messages within that group. If your child is added to a group with someone that they have previously blocked, that person can still see their messages and send them messages within the group chat. If your child is using WhatsApp, check their group privacy settings to see who can add them to groups. Ensure your child understands that they can leave a chat at any time, and they know how to report users. Find out more here: <https://faq.whatsapp.com/424124173736394>
- **Inappropriate content:** users can be exposed to content that is not suitable for their age.
- **Location sharing:** talk to your child about when this would be appropriate to use and the potential danger of sharing their location.
- **Chat lock/secret code:** users can lock chats as well as apply a secret code setting so a chat does not appear in the main chat.

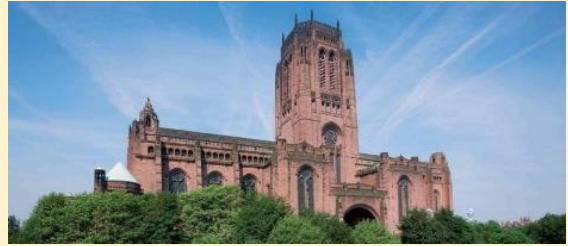
## A SPOTLIGHT ON: CURRICULUM & CULTURAL OFFER



### What is the Curriculum & Cultural Offer at St. Ann's?

At St Ann's we recognise that helping our children to grow isn't just about their academic development: it is about their personal development too.

Developing our children's cultural awareness and experiences is a golden thread that runs through everything we do at St Ann's, from what your child experiences on a day to day basis, to learning outside the classroom and beyond the school day, to inviting you and your families to experience cultural events in the wider community.



*I believe that all children can and should benefit from receiving a wide-ranging, adventurous and creative Cultural Education. For many young people, Cultural activities form a vital part of their everyday lives. These activities are academically, physically and socially enriching, whether they take place in school or out-of-school. (Darren Henley, 2012)*

### A Broad Cultural Education for All



Schools remain the single most important place where children learn about Cultural Education. This begins with our curriculum. All units of work in each subject has a cultural focus, whether that is the study of contrasting countries to our own in Geography, unique artwork from around the world in Art and Design, or the customs of different civilization in History. From the texts we choose for English lessons to the food created in Design and Technology, children are exposed to aspects of different cultures throughout their classroom learning.

Experiencing cultural events and visiting the cultural venues on our door step, is also a significant part of our cultural offer at St Ann's. From musical theatre to residential, from art galleries to museums, by the time children leave our school they will have experienced a minimum of fourteen cultural and curriculum visits or experiences. Did you know these visits are subsidized by the school?



And of course, our programme of after school clubs, also supports our vision for developing our pupils' cultural knowledge.

### Cost Free Culture Newsletters



St Ann's parents receive regular newsletters which signpost low or no cost cultural experiences in the St Helens and Liverpool area. We hope these newsletters provide you with ways in which you can develop your child's cultural awareness as a family.

As well as having regular fire drills at St Ann's, we also practice what to do in the event of a lockdown. The difference between the two however, is that we give the children some notice about the lockdown practice to mitigate any worries they may have in relation to this.

All being well, our lockdown practice will take place this half term. Prior to the lockdown, teachers will talk to their class in an age-appropriate way about what a lockdown is and what we do when a lockdown is announced to keep safe. You may like to talk to your child about this at home, and ask them about what happens in their class when this is announced.

## **SAFEGUARDING TOP TIP #8:**

### **Anti-bullying week**

Bullying is when individuals or groups seek to harm, intimidate or coerce someone who is perceived to be vulnerable.

It can involve people of any age, and can happen anywhere – at home, school or using online platforms and technologies (cyberbullying). This means it can happen at any time.

Bullying encompasses a range of behaviours which may be combined and may include the behaviours and actions we have set out below.

#### **Verbal abuse:**

- name-calling
- saying nasty things to or about a child or their family.

#### **Physical abuse:**

- hitting a child
- pushing a child
- physical assault.

#### **Emotional abuse:**

- making threats
- undermining a child
- excluding a child from a friendship group or activities.

#### **Cyberbullying/online bullying:**

- excluding a child from online games, activities or friendship groups
  - sending threatening, upsetting or abusive messages
  - creating and sharing embarrassing or malicious images or videos

'trolling' - sending menacing or upsetting messages on social networks, chat rooms or online games

- voting for or against someone in an abusive poll
- setting up hate sites or groups about a particular child

creating fake accounts, hijacking or stealing online identities to embarrass a young person or cause trouble using their name.

Bullying and cyberbullying can be a form of discrimination, particularly if it is based on a child's disability, race, religion or belief, gender identity or sexuality.

Follow these rules and stay safe online just like me!!!

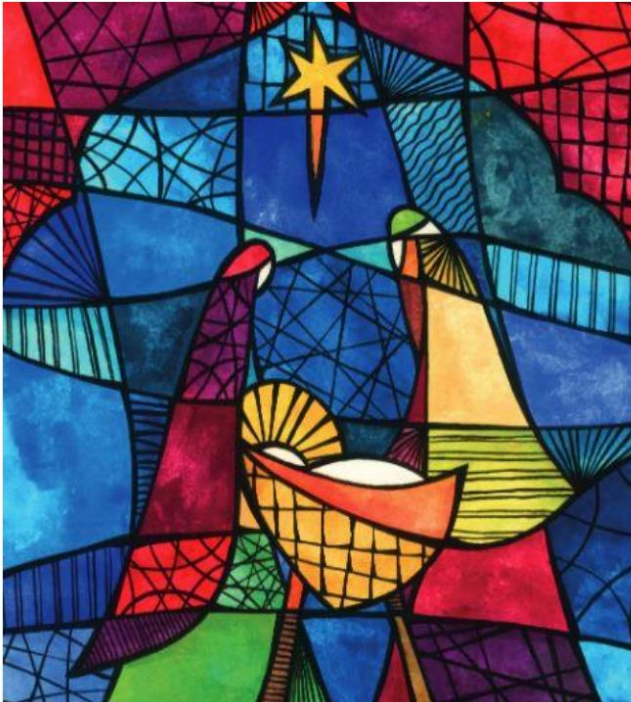
**Use a Password Manager**  
It is best practice to have different random passwords for all of your accounts. A password manager is the best approach. Remember to enable 2-factor authentication on your password manager.

**Email Cautions**  
When in doubt, throw it out. Do not open attachments or click on links if you are suspicious.

**Public Wifi Cautions**  
Wifi in public areas can be unsafe. Try using your phone's cellular as a hotspot instead. If you must use public wifi, use with a VPN.

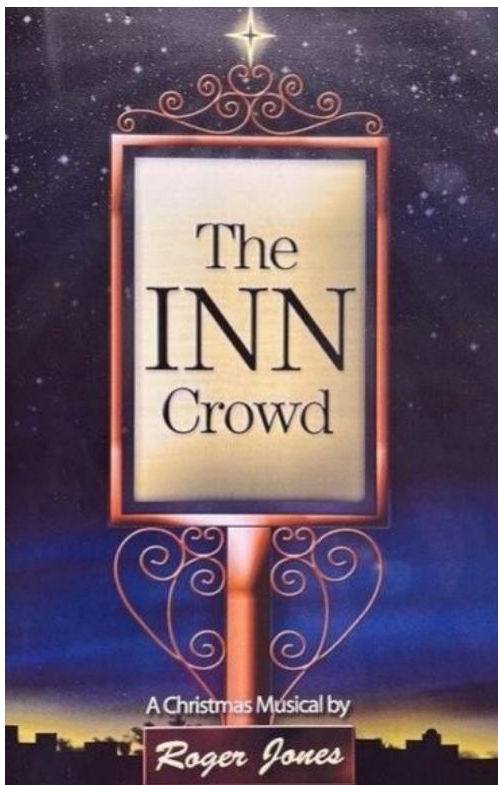
**Encrypt Your Devices**  
Your devices should be encrypted in case they get lost or stolen. Macs have FileVault, PCs have Bitlocker, and mobile devices have their own built-in solutions.

**Antivirus / Antimalware**  
Install endpoint protection on macs and PCs

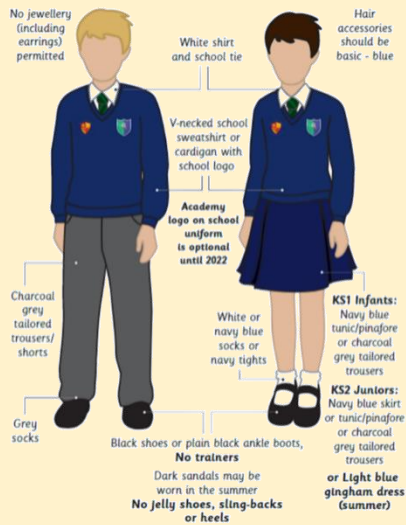
